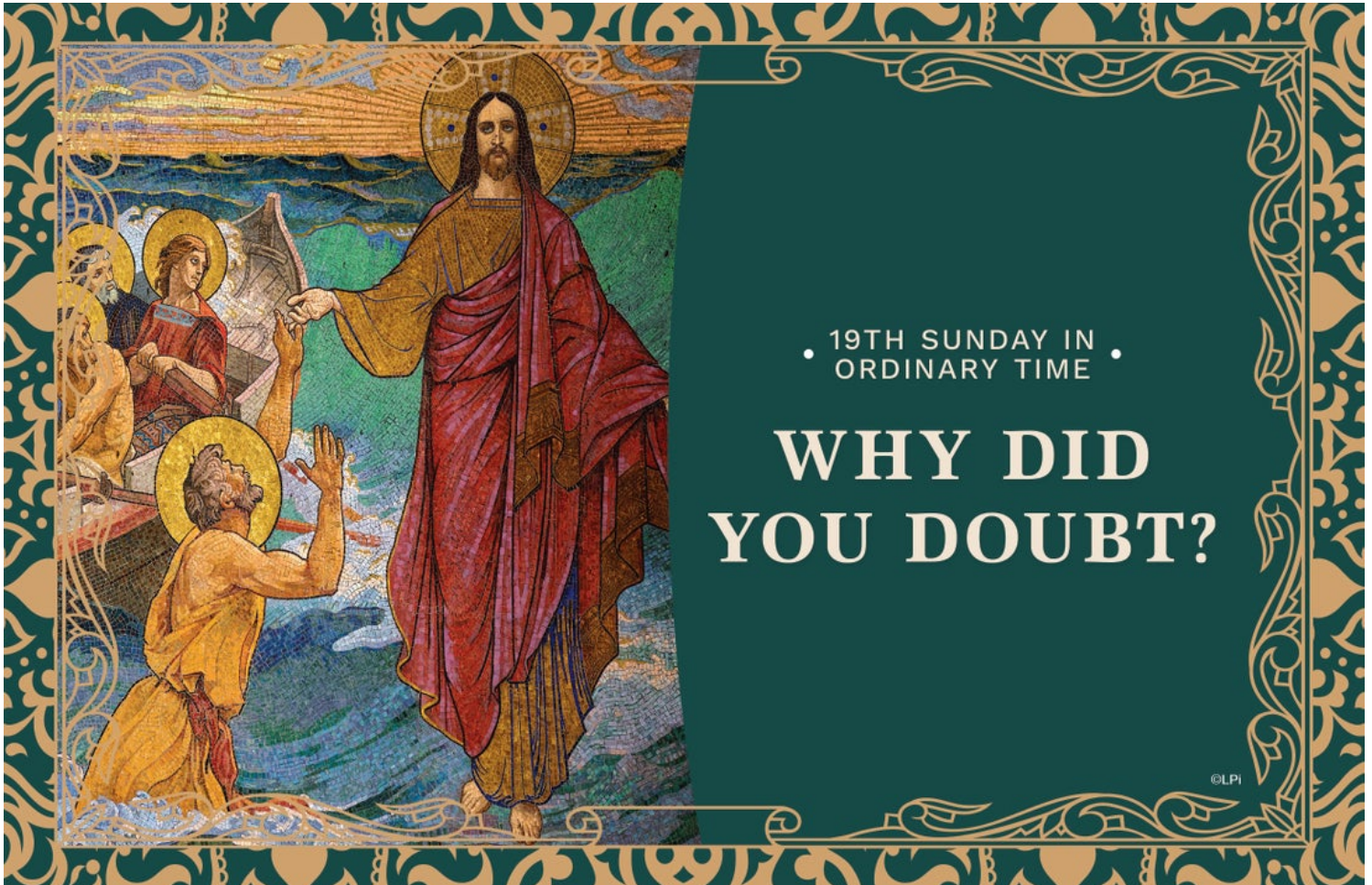

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops encourages daily service, not just during special events.

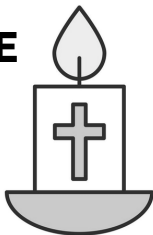

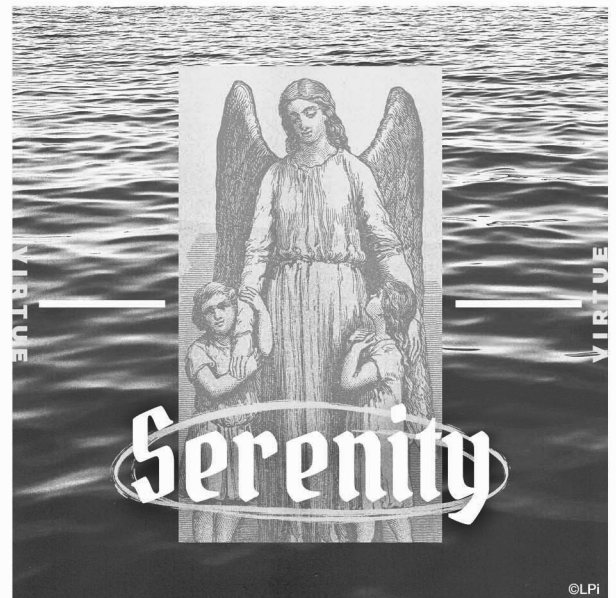
