Parish Fiscal Year Ending

We budgeted \$303,000 for stewardship this fiscal year, a decrease of 2% from last year and 4.5 % from the year before. Right now we're at \$247,966.

In order to reach our budgeted goal we will need \$55,033 by the end of June, or \$11,006 each of the next 5 weeks. In June of 2019, almost \$68,000 came in the office for stewardship. It can happen!
