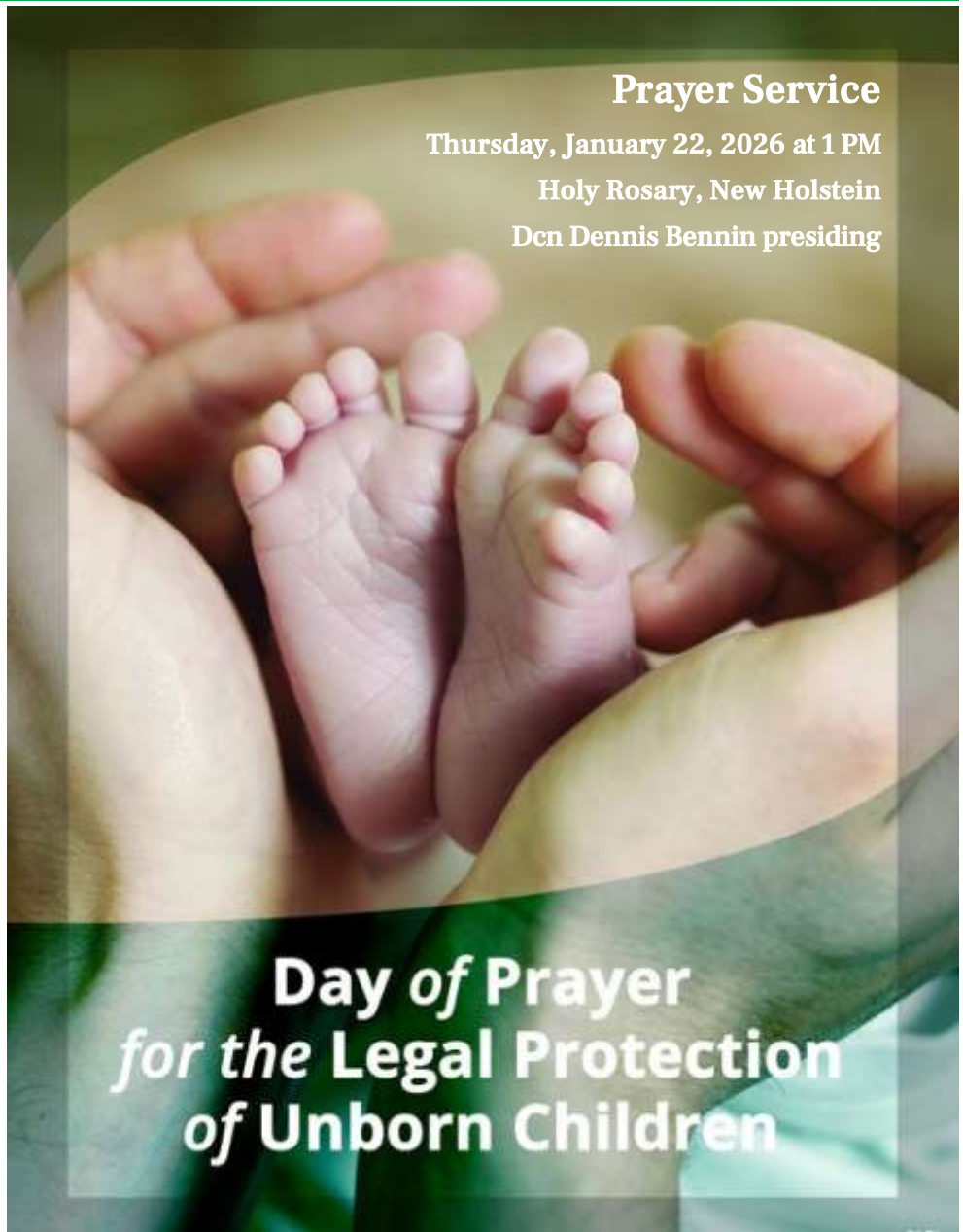

Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn

On Thursday, January 22, 2026, Holy Rosary will have a prayer service for the legal protection of the unborn at 1 PM with Deacon Dennis Bennin presiding. The day of prayer for the legal protection of unborn children 2026 is an annual observance that encourages faith communities to pray for respect for every human life and for legal frameworks that protect unborn children and support mothers. In many places, the date is linked to 22 January, a historical legal milestone in the United States. Even after changes in the legal landscape in recent years, communities continue to pray for wise, humane laws; for a culture that honors life; and for families to receive the care they need.

Help Build a Culture of Life

Beginning on January 22, 1973 with Roe v. Wade, and during the nearly 50-year period following the Supreme Court decision, nearly 64 million children have been killed—and untold numbers of women and men suffer in the aftermath. Even with the overturning of Roe v. Wade in June 2022, many states continue not to recognize children in their mothers' wombs as persons warranting protection, and federal laws fail to protect the lives of unborn children.

This coming Thursday, January 22 is designated as a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. "Only with prayer—prayer that storms the heavens for justice and mercy, prayer that cleanses our hearts and souls—will the culture of death that surrounds us today be replaced with a culture of life." U.S. Catholic Bishops This is a call to action.

The 40 Days for Life Lent Campaign will start on Ash Wednesday, February 18. Through peaceful prayer we support a culture of life at the grass roots level. No training is needed. You only need to be present and pray silently, and if you get the opportunity direct others to the pregnancy help center right across the street. Join us by signing up for vigil hours outside Planned Parenthood in Sheboygan during this 40-day period.

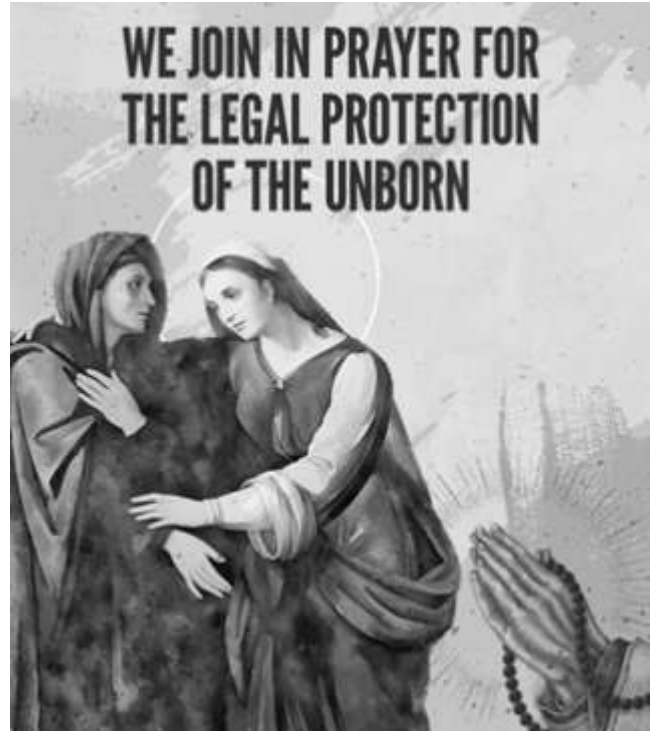
