

Deacon's Perspective

We are in the Second Week of Advent, of which is the beginning of our new Church/Liturgical year. And we as Catholics should consider as we enter and continue our journey in the Season of Advent that it **is through ‘prayer, penance, and preparation** focusing on the themes of hope, peace, love, and joy while waiting and **anticipating Christ’s birth and second coming.**

But what does this all mean? How do we navigate all that the world throws at us in the context of our faith? We Catholics often hear differing thoughts and ideas of what is expected of us, especially as we are waiting for the Birth of the King. Perhaps if we think of Advent as a season of hopeful anticipation and penitential preparation for the threefold coming of Jesus Christ; in history (Christmas), in our daily lives now, and in glory at the end of time.

I have rightly heard many times “Merry Christmas” and I always respond in like manner, but with all the preparation all of us go through, how in the world can we slow down enough for this season of Advent? It’s really hard.

I remember visiting with someone in one of our local Assisted living facilities (we have four facilities). I often stop and visit with this person, and we have wonderful, faith filled conversations, but that day this person was so weighed down with what to give their adult children and grandchildren for Christmas. What do I give them, so each gets an equal amount. Do I give money, or what kind of gift, and what **about the grandchildren. I can’t give one less than the next one.** It was painful and sad to watch and listen to. I was unable to speak to this person what I was thinking; because of being so consumed with the struggle, that this person could not hear what I was trying to say. This person said, **“I wish my spouse was alive and here so**

that I wouldn’t have this pressure, frustration, and headache”.

We often place ourselves in a self-imposed prison. We lock ourselves in positions in which we cannot see our way out. I felt and feel bad for this person, but how many more of us are struggling as this person is? I tried to help this person realize that God is ever present, never far from us. But unfortunately, this person lost in their struggle, was emotionally and spiritually not present, and it fell on deaf ears.

We must, as best we can, try and remember that we are not separated from Jesus. Consider if you will, that sometimes in your weariness, you pray and seek understanding of the situation in your life. Jesus will give you the answers you seek, both in terms of your spiritual condition and in terms of the holiest way to conduct yourself in each situation you encounter. Jesus promises to us that the greatest amount of mercy will be obtained through your commitment to remaining with Him, united in the life that is yours. All is well. Jesus is with you! God will be generous to us, His beloved, in this holy time of Advent. Be acutely aware of His presence. When you look at everything around you, look through the eyes and heart of Jesus.

This will give you the understanding that will insure peace for you. All is well. The infant returns through your heart, as the King.

The story of Advent is a story of repentance. John the Baptist held up a mirror to the chosen people. He urged them to look at what they saw there. This Advent, will we look in the mirror? Will we choose repentance?

Mass will be celebrated at Holy Rosary at 8:30 am and at SS. Peter & Paul at 6:30 pm on Monday, December 8. It is a holy day of obligation.

We order every Monday until after the holidays.

Scrip is sold in the office during the weekly office hours.

You can call or email Kim your order if you want and it'll be ready for you, no waiting if you're in a hurry. It is also sold after the weekend Mass down in Voland Hall.

WEShare On-Line Giving

Venmo is now enabled for our on-line giving. Digital wallets like Apple Pay, Google Pay, Venmo, and PayPal allow users to complete transactions with just a few taps, eliminating the need to enter payment details repeatedly.
