## **Patrick J. Boyle, S.J.: In Memoriam**

Attending the funeral of one's former teachers is often a unique moment to give thanks and to pay tribute. Such was my experience recently when I was in Chicago for the funeral of a former seminary formator.

Father Patrick Boyle who was 90 years old when he died, was a Jesuit priest, a legend and a fixture of the Mundelein seminary faculty. He dedicated close to 40 years of his priestly life as a professor of moral theology, a spiritual father and confessor to scores of seminarians and priests.

With three bishops and over 60 priests, most of whom were former students, concelebrating his funeral mass, it seems evident that he made quite the impact. He was that rarest of creatures, a Jesuit who invested a large chunk of his priesthood in the formation of diocesan priests and was exceptionally good at it.

Father Boyle's ministry was also marked by his experience as a veteran of the Vietnam war where he served as a paratrooper in the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division and a chaplain with the 1<sup>st</sup> Cavalry Division in the U.S. Army during that war (1969-71). Chaplain Boyle's bravery in that conflict is amply attested by the decorations and national recognitions he had received which includes two silver stars and a bronze star. As they say, he was the real deal.

His sense of humor was legendary as was his capacity for banter. As one would expect from a former Chaplain and retired colonel in the US Army, Pat Boyle was nothing if not direct and candid. His gruff exterior, I later discovered, was only a cover for a heart that is remarkably large and tender. "Hey kid" was his nickname for almost every seminarian during my time. I remember one Sunday evening, when I walked past him as we were leaving the dining hall. As he got older, he was no longer a particularly fast walker. He called out, "Hey kid" and I kept walking, pretending as if he was calling someone else. Besides, I thought, he didn't know my name. After all, there were over a hundred seminarians on campus at the time. Then he

called my name and said, "Come here. I want to talk to you." When I came, wondering what in the world Fr. Boyle wanted to talk to me about, he said, "Did you call your mother this weekend?" I answered hesitantly, "No, I didn't." He said, "Why is that?" "Oh, I was writing a paper," I said, "and by the time I realized it, it was already too late to

call." He looked me straight in the eye and said sternly, "Call your mother first thing tomorrow morning. The day will come when you may want to speak to her only to realize that she is no longer alive, that she has gone home to the Lord. I know what I am saying from experience." I was stunned by his deeply meaningful words. I thanked him and left but resolved to call my mother first thing in the morning. He cared about his students. He loved them. He knew their names, even the ones in first year as I then was.

A number of the seminarians at Mundelein during my time were of Vietnamese heritage with parents that emigrated to the United States after the Vietnam war. Father Boyle did not fail to remind them at every opportunity he got, especially in class, that their forebears were once enemies of the United States. He would say things like, "Hey kid, your grandfather or was it your father, wanted me dead. But I have forgiven them... and you. After all the gospel says, love your enemies." One of these students known for his sharp wit and quick comebacks had an answer ready for him. The next time Father Boyle said, "Your grandfather shot at me." The seminarian said, "No he didn't" "Yes he did," Father Boyle responded, "but I forgave him." "No he didn't" the young seminarian insisted. "How would you know?" Father Boyle inquired. "Because he wouldn't have missed," the seminarian declared. That nearly brought the house down.

To another seminarian, he said, "Hey kid, you are getting a little round in the middle. You should try going to the gym sometime. You know where that is?" To which the young man responded without missing a beat "So should you Father. You need it as much as I do. Should I give you a call on my way to scope it out?" He simply smiled and shook this head.

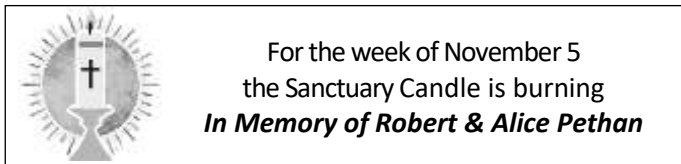

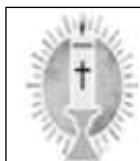
