To Carry the Cross

Carry the cross? Absolutely. I'm happy to! Hand it over. Here's the thing: I just might...set it down for a second, from time to time. That's okay, right?

How else am I supposed to have both hands free to gesture in anger? I can't do that if I'm carrying the cross. Well, fine, then let me just shift its weight, so I can catch my breath and say what I think about this person who's got it all wrong — I'll just lean it against the wall here. No? Okay, fine, I won't put it down! I'll keep holding it. That's better, actually. Then I can use it as a weapon.

What? Am I doing this "Christian" thing wrong?

"Whoever wishes to save his life will lose it," Jesus tells us in today's Gospel. "But whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."

This is not an affirmation of the paradox that if you no longer care about something, you can finally have it once and for all. It's not a judgment about the worthlessness of life in this fallen world or the futility of trying to preserve that life.

It's merely a statement about priorities.

When Peter says, "God forbid!" at the thought of suffering, God is not his priority. His own safety is.

When I say, "God forbid!" at anything that comes from the mouth of God, it's a reminder to look at my hands — because they've probably put down the cross.

How merciful is our Lord — he never takes my cross from me, even when I walk far away from it. He always lets me pick it back up. In his dear and sweet goodness, he even helps me lift its weight. And he gestures, in case I've forgotten: "This way. Follow me."

Why do we do that?

Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why do priests wear vestments? Do they have a special meaning?

Answer:

Vestments are clothes worn for a specific purpose. Priests will joke that they cover a thousand flaws. But our own manner of dress often corresponds to what we do. We dress up for special occasions and for special guests. We wear certain clothes for golf, for outdoor activities, and years ago, we even had our "Sunday best" clothes we wore just for Church. Vestments are much the same, and each one has a meaning. The alb is a reminder of the baptismal garment. The stole is a symbol of ordained ministry and authority within the Church. The chasuble reminds us that we are on a pilgrimage of faith, passing through this life towards heaven.

Priests wear vestments for two basic reasons. First, they draw attention to the importance and solemnity of the act of worship. The color of the vestments indicates the season of the year or the feast being celebrated. Secondly, vestments draw attention to what the priest does, rather than who he is. In the celebration of the Mass, the focus is on what we do together, on our common unity, and on the mystery and person of Christ.

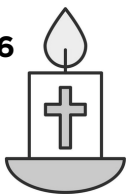

Rays of Hope Community Food Pantry

We love because God loved us first. We share what we have because we recognize all is gift. We care for the widow, the orphan, and the stranger because we can relate to their suffering, and in those instances that we struggle to relate, we show compassion because the God who has done great things for us commands it (see Deuteronomy 10:17-21).

Rays of Hope helps over 80 families a month. Bins are at the side entrances and in the narthex under the TV to collect items for them. Their most needed items are cereal, pasta sauces, Hamburger Helper, canned fruit, Chunky soups, and boxed/bagged pasta and rice. Can you give \$5 worth of food a week to help? Watch the sale flyers and grab something on sale for the week.

Pie Stand Numbers

154 parishioners made all the desserts and/or gave money in support of our pie stand. That's 39% of our parishioners that received a reminder postcard. That included 49 apple pies, 20 pumpkin pies and 19 pecan pies, along with 16 other various flavors that were baked for the weekend. And 18 cherry, 14 oreo, 13 poppyseed and 13 choc eclair tortes were made, along with 13 other flavors. We certainly had a great selection of desserts to choose from.

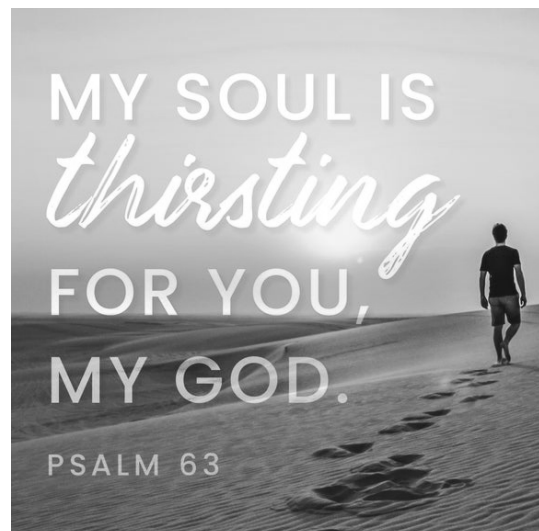
