These past couple of weeks we have had many readings to choose from as we celebrated the Nativity, the Presentation in the Temple, the Feast of the Holy Family, and now this coming weekend the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God.

God in all His Wisdom chose a young girl to be His mother. Her child, the Savior of the world was born in a humble stable surrounded, not by royalty, but by animals and shepherds.

FORMED

Signing up on FORMED has become a lot easier and parish codes and custom registration urls are no longer needed. Now parishioners just go to formed.org/signup and find their parish to sign up for the first time.

1. Go to formed.org/signup
2. Select your parish by entering name, city or zip code
3. Enter your name and email address
4. Check that email account for a link to begin using FORMED.

Passwords are no longer needed. After you have initially "signed up" and created your account, simply "sign in" to formed.org by entering your email. You will then need to check your email on the same device for an authentication email. Going forward, as long as you don't log out or clear your cookies, you will remain signed in.

"SEARCH" from the menu bar and then type a title, a subject or a speaker/author you're looking for.

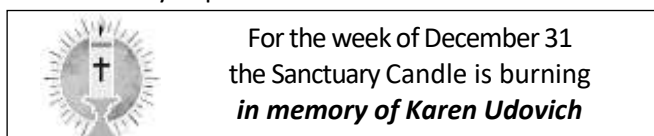
