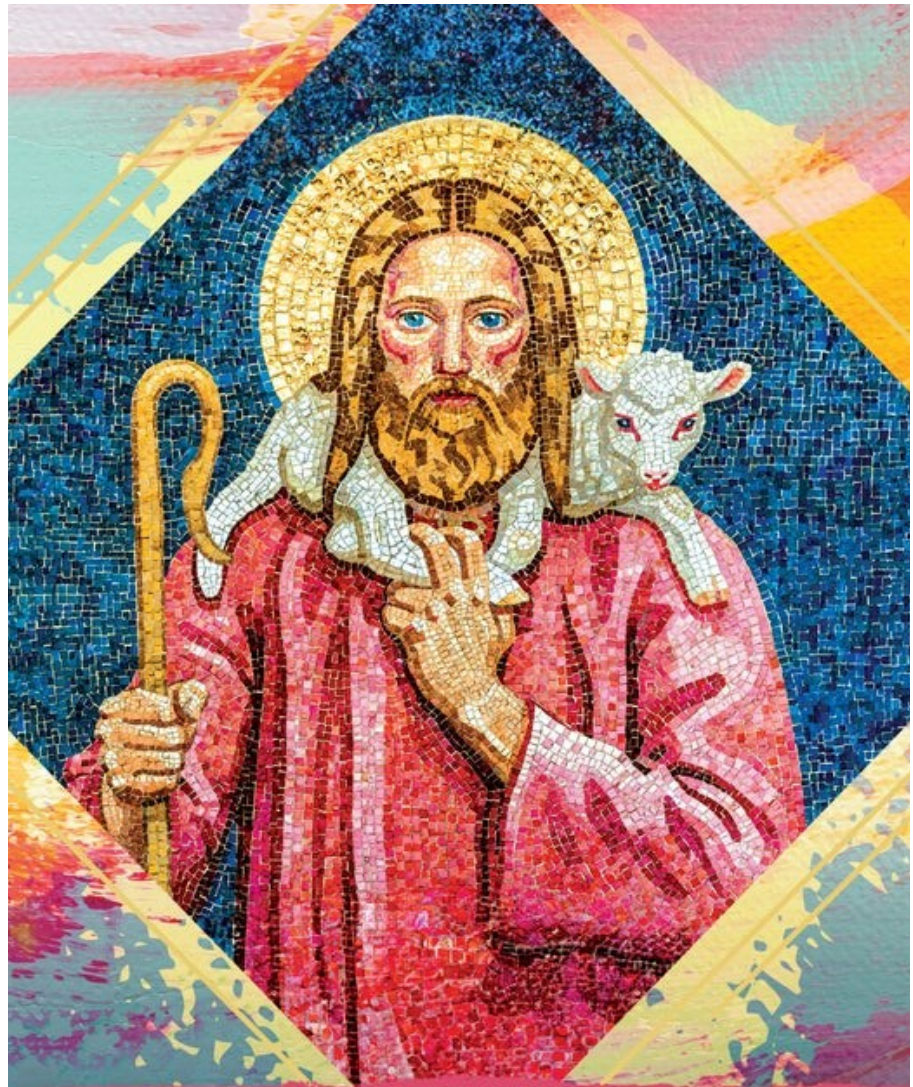

Deacon's Perspective

This past week I had the pleasure to visit the classrooms at Divine Savior School, and it was interesting and enjoyable. In one of the younger classrooms I was asked a question that I had to think about how to answer in such a way that the children would understand. It was a wonderful opportunity and challenge to explain and help the children to understand on their level. Oh, that question was; ***'Why did Jesus have to die on the cross?'*** I bring this up because our second reading has deep implications for all of us. To refresh your memory:

"Beloved: See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God. Yet so we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know Him. Beloved, we are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is.

1 John 3:1-2

I sometimes like to answer questions from the children with another question, so I asked them; ***'Do you love your mommies and daddies?'*** And of course, they all resoundingly said Yes! Then I asked a follow-up question, ***'do you listen to and obey everything they tell you to do?'*** They answered that question with much less enthusiasm, much more subdued, and some didn't answer the question. It was a good experience, but I think you get the point, and I hope the children as well. But then again, that is the point; "do you love God"? This is not a rhetorical question, and it requires an answer from all of us, and not to me or to the priest, but to God directly. Why did Christ die on the cross? Have you given thought to this? What is our response to this greatest of gifts all of us were given?

In the Gospel we hear Jesus say to us: *"I am the good shepherd, and I know mine*

and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep."

Do you know the Father? Do you know His Son Jesus Christ? How well do you know Him, or don't know Him? Have you thrown your net into the deep in search of this relationship that God is desiring with each of?

In previous articles I've quoted the writings from Luisa Piccarretta, and the following is another that fits so eloquently; (*Jesus to Luisa Piccarretta*)

"See everything you do passes into Heaven. Therefore, see with what purity you must operate, thinking that steps, words, and works come before my presence, and if they are pure - that is, if they are done for Me - I take greatest delight in them and I feel them around Me like many messengers that remind Me continuously of you. But if they are done for low and earthly purposes, I feel bothered by them!

So, how would you have had answered the children's question 'why did Jesus die on the cross'? I suspect someday, each of us will have this answer question, it may be good to find that answer today.

Eucharistic Revival

The Church in the United States is observing a year of Eucharistic Revival, which is a moment to emphasize and celebrate our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. In this light, the celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) to be observed this year on June 2, takes on an added significance. It is traditional and customary in many Catholic countries to engage in Eucharistic Processions in celebration of the Solemnity.

Here in our three-linked parishes, the challenges of geographical distance do not allow us to physically carry out a walking Eucharistic Procession that will involve our three parish communities. This celebration, however, will not go unobserved in our parishes. Hence, we shall have a Eucharistic Motorcade instead after the 10am Mass at Holy Rosary Church on June 2nd, 2024. Parish-

ioners from our three linked parishes are welcome to Holy Rosary for the beginning of the motorcade.

From Holy Rosary Church, the motorcade will proceed to St. Ann's Church for a brief stop and Adoration.

From there, it will proceed to SS. Peter and Paul, Kiel where it will conclude with a Benediction and Praying of the Divine Praises.

National Eucharistic Pilgrimage

The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will pass through the Diocese of Green Bay on its way to Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress in July.

SS Peter and Paul will celebrate a special Mass with Bishop David Ricken and Archbishop Jerome Listecky of the Milwaukee Archdiocese on Tuesday June 18, 2024 at 5 pm. At that mass the Eucharistic Pilgrimage Monstrance will be handed over to the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. All are invited to attend.

We are planning a meal after Mass. What a great joy to host both Bishops that day! More details will be shared as the day gets closer.

We’re running low on envelopes so if anyone has extra stewardship envelopes that we could use please bring them to the office. If the office is closed, feel free to drop them in the white dropbox located on the left side of the office front door. Just be sure to mark them extras.

New to the scrip box is Badger’s Den in \$20 gift certificates with a 10% rebate. They can only used on food purchases. Plus we have over 20 more eating places in stock if you’d like to grab a bite to eat.

Scrip is sold in the office during the week during office hours. You can call or email Kim your order if you want. It is also sold after weekend Masses in Voland Hall.

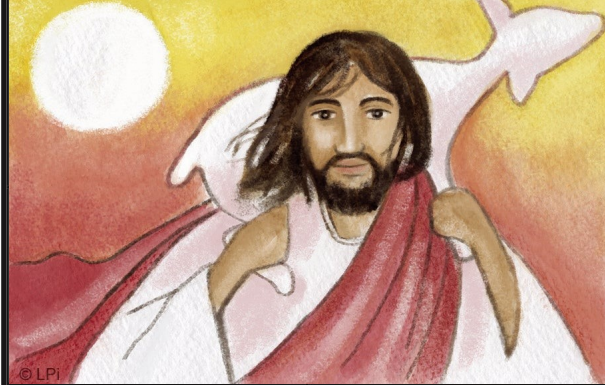
