Deacon's Perspective

How is Lent going for you? This is an amazing time for us to be alive and to be part of God's plan in the world. We know that nothing is outside the Plan of God, nothing is random with God. If you've not heard that before, than please know that God has you and I here in this time and place for something great. What might that be? Good question! This particular Sunday is the Third Sunday of Lent, and that might give us a clue. The readings are another clue, and another possibility for your consideration is that we are witnessing two people coming into the Catholic Church (becoming Catholic).

Joshua Davila is a Catechumen, which means he will be Baptized, Confirmed, and receive his First Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil (Holy Saturday). Then we have Mariah Zawislan, who is a candidate, which means she is a baptized member of the Lutheran church, and she will be Confirmed, and receive her First Holy Communion as a member of the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. This is a rare privilege for all of us to witness, but even more to impact their lives and have an impression on them with our lives, and to help in their Spiritual Growth.

What do I mean by 'Spiritual Growth'? This is not difficult to understand, and when looking at our readings this Sunday what immerses might very well help us to understand what this means, Specifically, the Gospel from John speaks of Living Water, **and worshipping in Spirit and Truth.** I'll focus on worshipping in Spirit and Truth. When I meet and spend time with these two people,

who are preparing to come into the Church, I've mentioned this story of Jesus and the woman at the well, and what Jesus told the woman.

"the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and Truth; and indeed, the Father seeks such people to worship Him. God is Spirit, and those who worship Him **must worship in Spirit and Truth."**

I often say; religion is good, but it's not enough. Frequently they hear me say: knowledge is good, but if it does not travel **from your head to your heart then it's just** information. Information is good, but not enough to hold our heart and soul to true worship. Jesus teaches that authentic worship is not tied to a particular mountain or temple but is rooted in the heart transformed by grace. Because of this conversation between Jesus and the woman, we can see the new covenant in Christ, worship centered on the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit, and the Eucharistic liturgy, where the Church worships in Spirit and truth

This conversation between Jesus and the woman marks a shift from external ritual alone to interior conversion and communion **with God. It's a conversion of the heart and** learning who we are, and whose we are in the sight of God.

Please pray for Joshua and Mariah as they become Catholic at the Easter Vigil!


