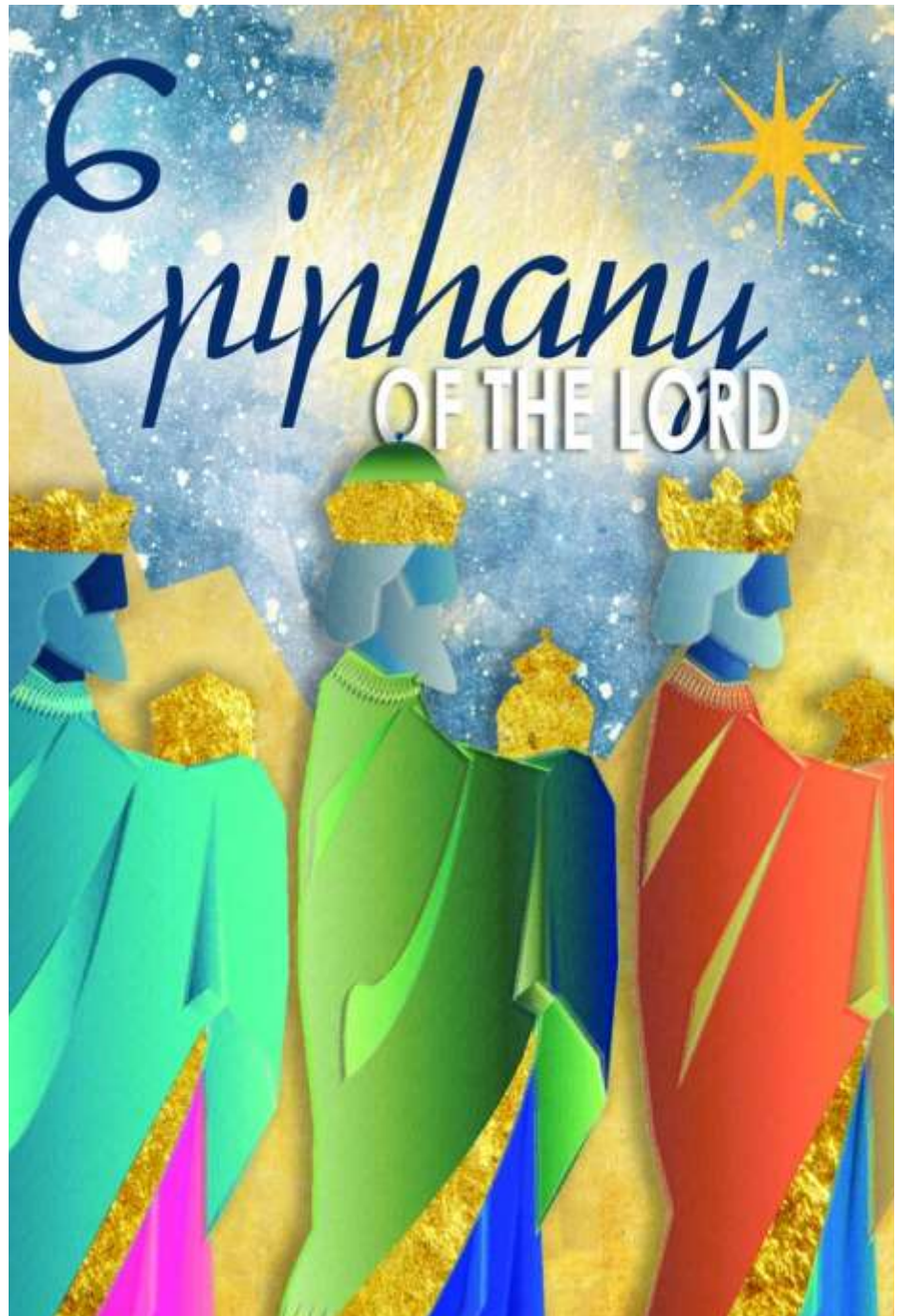

## Deacon's Diary

**"We three kings of Orient are,"** Many Christmas songs we've grown up with have led us to assume many things that may not be true. If that opening verse of the song we know from memory were true to Sacred Scripture, it would be sung as: **"We group of priests who interpret stars and dreams through the occult, and come from Persia, which will one day be called Iran."** You see, we don't really know how many men came searching for Jesus. Three was just a popular number associated with the story because of the three gifts. The truth be told, any number of them could have packed their coffers and combined their gifts.

The fact that they are identified as kings, may stem from the use of psalm 72 to identify their tribute: **"The kings of Arabia and Sheba shall bring tribute: all kings shall pay Him homage."** Even the camels are not found in scripture, but it is assumed a caravan from that region would have included some camels to carry their provisions. The Magi would not have found Jesus in the stable either. Scripture reports they found him at his house. So why have we assimilated so much false information in the story; because it makes the story more endearing.

We humans love our traditions and have the habit of assuming them into truth; or, should I say we easily take things for granted when we hear them often enough. **When we hear over and over: "The Catholic Church is un-caring, behind the times, or doesn't understand our human needs" we may agree with those claims rather than look deeper into the reason for certain "truths" the Church teaches. It's times like this that we need to follow the light.**

There is one fact about the Magi that all accounts agree upon. That fact is what prompted them to begin their journey

in the first place. They saw a bright light that drew them to search where it would lead them. They were willing to leave their comfort zones and travel through barren lands and rough roads. They even became lost for a time and asked for directions to be able to come to the light. And when the light came to rest over the home of the **"True Light" they didn't** hesitate to offer their gifts to Him.



This is what we need to ask ourselves as we emerge from this season of **"Light."** **"Am I** willing to leave my comfort zone to see where the light leads me?" **Will I be willing** to travel over rough uncharted territory to pursue that light? If I

get lost along the way, will I seek direction to get back on track? When I come to my destination, will I offer my gifts?

Pope Francis, during his 2023 homily on the Epiphany, shared a new perspective on the magi.

He explained that, while they are best known for the gifts that they receive:

- The gift of call—God calling them.
- The gift of discernment—being able to **ignore Herod and choose God's way.**
- The gift of surprise—meeting God in a humble manger.

Pope Francis suggests these are calls that we all receive.

**"Brothers and sisters, we are all called —** the first gift: the call — by Jesus; we can all discern — the second gift: discernment — discern his presence; we can all experience his surprises — **the third gift: the surprise,"** he said.

We had a great month of sales! Thanks to everyone who used the Scrip program for Christmas gifts and holiday

shopping. In December, just over 200 individual orders totaled \$78,000, for a profit of \$3,300. A special thanks to the companies that bought their Christmas gifts for their employees through our program. We hope some of you “Christmas Users” can become “Regular Users”.

This week \$10,000 was given back to the parish for the general budget, for a grand total of \$455,000 since June 1995! Still not sure about it? Talk to a Scrip representative after Mass in Voland Hall or call Kim in the office.

### Heating Project Extras

New lights will be installed in the church basement as the project comes to a close in January. We did not plan to replace the lights, but it’s a good time to upgrade to energy efficient lights when the new ceiling is being installed. 30 lights needs replacing, and each light costs approximately \$200, or \$6,000 total. Since it wasn’t originally planned, this cost was not included in the total scope of the project. If you would like to sponsor a light to bring the cost down, we would be grateful. The heating project is coming to an end and we’re looking for some volunteers who would be willing to roll up their sleeves and clean. Looking at starting after the ceiling is in, hopefully January 22. Voland Hall, the gym, the gym bathrooms, and the church kitchen are areas that will need a good spring cleaning, even though it’s only January. Dust is everywhere! Everything, including the bleachers, has to be wiped down, and all the dishes will have to be run through the dishwasher, as well as the cupboards washed off.
