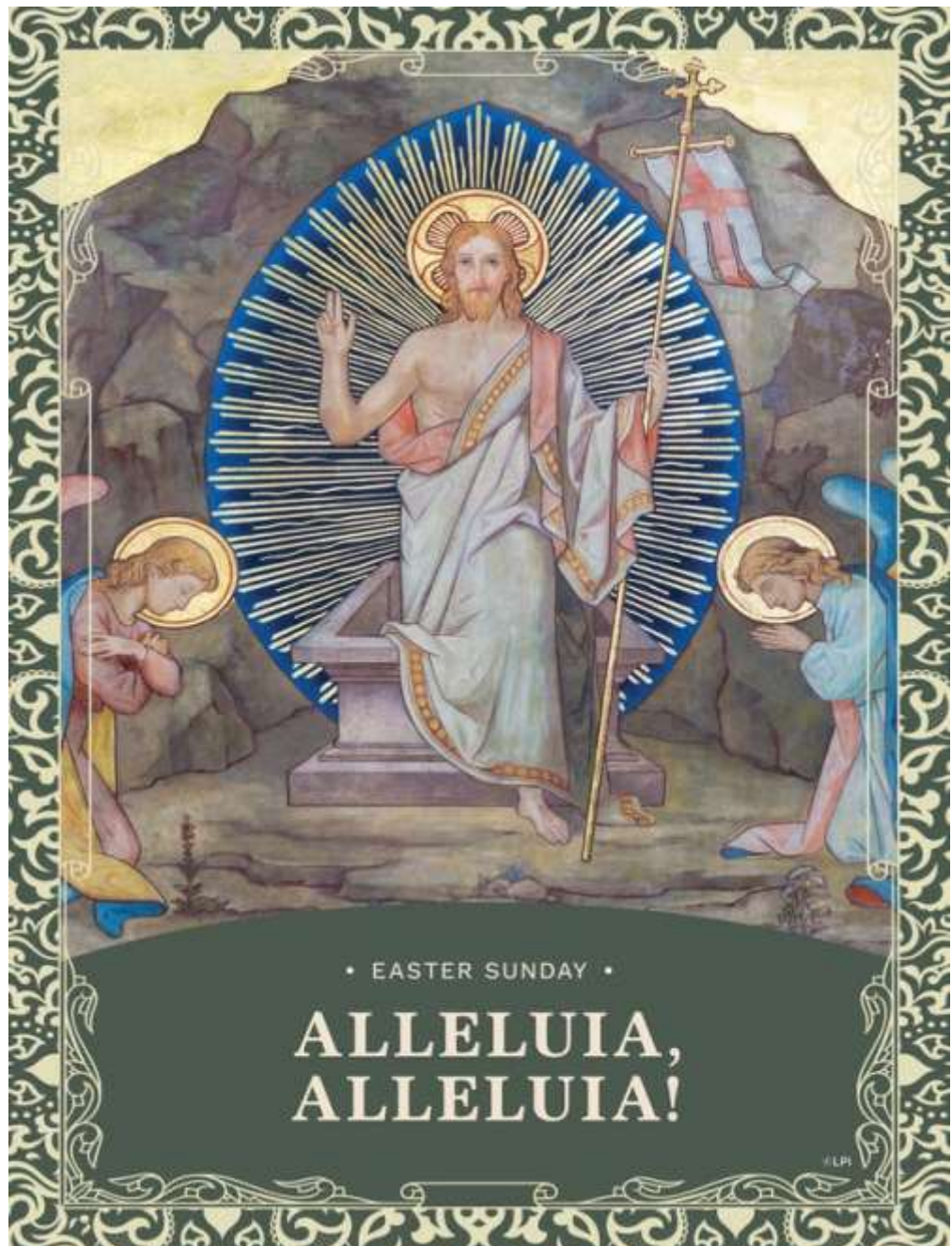

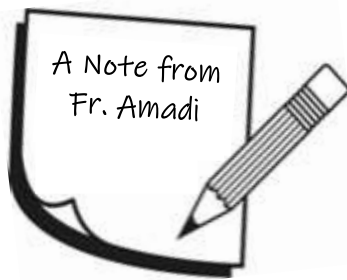

Dear Parishioners,
Greetings in the risen Christ! A week after Easter Sunday, I will be traveling to Nigeria for a family funeral and will be gone

for a week. My maternal uncle, Monsignor Cletus Ogu, passed away at the age of 88. Over the past year, his health had been declining. Monsignor Ogu is the first of **twelve siblings in my mother's family**. She is the seventh child. Ordained on April 2, 1967, Msgr Ogu served as a priest for 58 years. When he was ordained in 1967, African priests were still relatively rare in Southeastern Nigeria (where my family came from and are) as the Irish Missionary priests and nuns were still present and active. The bishop who ordained him was himself an Irish Missionary. As part of that early generation of local clergy to be ordained to the priesthood in Southeastern Nigeria, he was regarded by many as a trailblazer, an inspiration and a guiding light. It goes without saying that my grandparents were exceedingly proud of their son.

Selected to serve as seminary professor shortly after his ordination, he was sent to Rome for doctoral studies in the Liturgy in the 1970s. After he returned to Nigeria, he served as a seminary professor for over 20 years where he assisted in the formation of scores of Nigerian priests, many of whom hold prominent positions in the local Church. It had always been amazing to me, hearing his former students speak of their former vice-rector and liturgy professor with awe and reverence.

Growing up, however, he was that famous uncle whom everyone in the family talked about but whom we as kids rarely saw. I remembered, though, that the few times **"Father Cletus"** (as he was referred to in the

family even after he was named a Monsignor) visited our home, we prepared a little extra for his visit and we were instructed by my mother to be on our best behavior. He and my mother always had a special bond.

With twelve children in the family, my grandparents did not have the resources to send all of their children to school beyond primary school. This was especially the case with their daughters who were asked to help with farm work and chores around the house while the boys went to school. It was Father Cletus, however, who as a recently ordained priest, insisted that my mother should go to secondary school and he paid for her education himself. After secondary school, Mom went on to the Teacher Training College and met my father after she graduated and was working as a teacher. The education she received changed her life for the better and positively impacted my family.

When I was discerning the priesthood, my uncle Cletus took the back seat. He did not go out of his way to influence my decision one way or another. But I recall how much his face glowed with pride, and how giddy he was with joy on the day I was ordained a priest in Green Bay. Our family owes him so much; hence I will be travelling to celebrate his funeral Mass as he will be laid to rest in Nigeria on May 1st, 2025.

I would appreciate if you would kindly offer a prayer for his peaceful repose and for my safe travels.

Eternal rest grant him O Lord, and Let perpetual light, shine upon him. May he rest in peace, Amen.

Old Prescription Bottles

On the Saturday after Easter, April 26, the cities of New Holstein, Kiel and St. Ann will be asked to discard old prescription medicines. As you empty your old meds into a plastic ziploc bag, please keep the EMPTY orange/brown containers. We want to keep those containers out of the landfill. Your part is this: remove the labels and wash the bottles inside and out with hot soapy water. Let them air dry and then put the caps back on. Make sure they are all the way dry so they don't mold. Put the EMPTY cleaned bottles in a clean ziploc bag and drop the bag into the designated container in your church. These bottles will be sent to Matthew 25 Ministries. They, in turn, will see that doctors in third world countries will receive them and will use them to send medicines home with their patients, knowing that the meds will stay dry and clean until needed. Special Thanks

Thank you to JoAnne Schneider for donating the Easter Candle that we will use for the year. The candle is adorned with special symbols. Five grains of incense were inserted in the form of a cross, representing the five wounds of Christ. The other symbols placed on the candle were an Alpha and Omega, representing Christ as the beginning and the end (Revelation 21:6) and the numbers of the current year. Once the Easter season is over, the Paschal Candle will be kept near the baptismal font because it is used during the Sacrament of Baptism. When we are baptized and made new creatures in Christ, we receive Christ's light from the Paschal Candle as the priests pray "Receive the light of Christ" (Rite of Baptism for Children, #100). Just as the Paschal Candle is with believers through the beginning stages of their Christian journey, it is also present at the end, placed near the casket during funeral rites.
