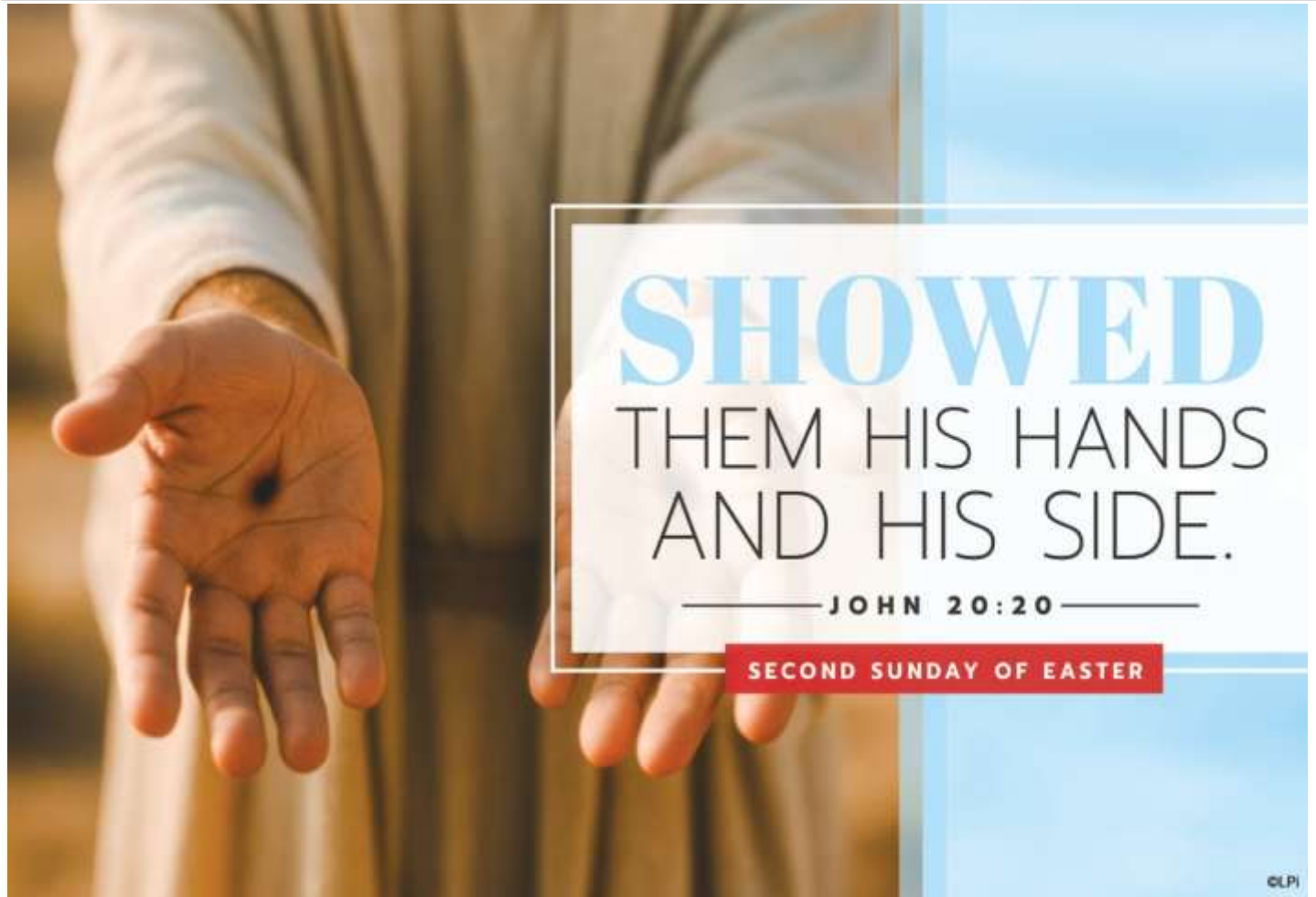

*The Seven Sacraments*

Catholics have seven Sacraments. Sacraments are visible physical signs of invisible grace instituted by Jesus Christ to dispense divine life, nurture faith, and provide spiritual **strength throughout a person's life.** They are considered essential for Salvation acting as tangible encounters with God that sanctify everyday life.

Most Catholics are familiar with the idea of *sacraments* in the Church, but few completely understand their profound intent. Sacraments are the foundation of the spiritual life for an individual and the Church. Sacraments are sources of grace — **God's very presence in our lives and unmerited favor from God.**

**They are signs of God's love, and these signs make present what they signify.** Although a person receives the gift of grace — from the sacraments regardless of whether he or she is well disposed to them, one must cooperate with what the Spirit is doing in the sacrament to receive its full benefit.

*Sacramentals* are different. These are also sacred signs that can build holiness, but they do not work on their own. One must be aware and fully conscious of the sacred action. Sacramentals sanctify us to get the most benefit from the Sacraments. Sacramentals are given to us to make holy certain actions

in life and life's circumstances. There are many such sacred signs that are reminders to us of God.

The sign of the cross is perhaps one of the most fundamental of these signs, and for Catholics, this invocation is done at the start of every sacred action and prayer. Holy water is a sacramental, as it reminds us of our Baptism. By dipping our fingers into holy water and making the sign of the cross, we are combining two foundational symbols of the Christian life and the Paschal Mystery — the passion, dying and rising of Christ — and bringing them to life in us.

The exchange of peace in the Mass — and at other Catholic rites — is another example of a sacramental. By making some kind of meaningful sign of peace, we are giving the peace of Christ to another person. The chalice and other sacred vessels at Mass also are sacramentals, as they remind us of what they are to contain — the very Body and Blood of Christ.

Our three linked parishes along with DS school currently have 23 students preparing for the Sacrament of First Eucharist and 14 students preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Please continue to keep these students in your prayers as they finalize their preparation.

The First Eucharist Masses will be at all three of our parishes on May 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Mass at each parish will be held at its regularly scheduled Mass time.

Save the date for our Three Parishes May Crowning Mass at SSPP.

Wednesday May 6<sup>th</sup> at 6 P.M.

Please join us for Mass and root beer floats following Mass in the Church Hall.

*It is heartening to see such a strong response throughout the diocese to the 2026 Bishop's Appeal.
