Medjugorje

Six children in Bosnia and Herzegovina reported seeing visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who identified herself as the "Queen of Peace". These purported apparitions began on June 24, 1981 in a small village called Medjugorje, with a message of peace and a call for conversion, prayer, and fasting.

Medjugorje is the only place in the world where the Virgin Mary appears **every day**. These apparitions have continued for over **four decades** and today Medjugorje is governed by the Vatican through a special papal envoy.

From the Principal's Pen

Gratitude works a bit like a lantern in November darkness. When we pause to thank God for the gifts in our lives, the light grows brighter and we see one another more clearly. As we enter this Thanksgiving season, we are reminded of the importance of gratitude; a virtue that roots us deeply in our faith and connects us to God and one another. Psalm 107 **reminds us to “give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, his mercy endures forever.”** Gratitude is not simply an act of saying “thank you,” **but a way of seeing the world through the lens of God’s grace.** It reminds us that everything we have: our families, our friends, our faith, and even the challenges we face, are gifts from a loving God who walks with us always.

In the classroom, children are encouraged to recognize and express thankfulness for the blessings in their lives, big and small.
