De Marillac Centre (Hope for Street Children) is one of the facilities of the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul.

It is a Non-Governmental Organization equipped with full accommodation facilities for the upkeep of the children on the streets. Therein, these children's necessities which include food, clothing, and shelter are adequately taken care of. Besides, their academic and other developmental needs are also taken good care of. So far, this rescue work of De Marillac Centre (Hope for Street Children) provide these children with a haven from the harsh world they have come to accept as 'normal.'

Street children also known as homeless children are children who live and work on the street, transact all their activities and spend most their valuable time on the street, without direct support from anybody; family, relations or friend. They are children forced by circumstances to be on the street. Some of those circumstances that led them to the streets are poverty, the death of one or both parents, the issue of labelling children witches/wizards, family or community violence and child abuse.

We have fifty-two (52) children; 36 boys and 16 girls living with us at the Centre, we call them residents or De Marillac Children. There are others (home-based beneficiaries) we support with foodstuff living with their indigent relatives. Their school fees and other school requirements are being provided for by the Centre.

We support yet another category called drop-ins; those who are still contemplating leaving street life. About 48 of them come in Mondays through Fridays when the resident children have gone to school. The drop-ins visit De Marillac Center to refresh, rest, listen to moral instruction and eat before heading back to the streets.

Every day in the Centre a total of one hundred and thirty-seven (137) children are fed; *52 resident children, 48 drop-in street children and 37 home-based beneficiaries*. We also reach out to others on the streets who are not able to visit the Centre because of distance, we take food to them.

De Marillac Center provides educational support to and rehabilitates street children in Port Harcourt and its environs. Besides enrolling the children in school up to the university level, some are registered in various vocational training centres they are interested in, with the guidance of staff working in the centre. In these vocational training centres, they boys are trained in wood working and the girls are taught sewing and dressmaking. At the Center the children also receive counselling and moral instruction, bible study/catechism class. We also offer care for drop-ins from Mondays – Fridays.

Working at the Center are Four (4) Sisters who are Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul. The sisters serve in the following capacities: Project Director, Counselor, Social Worker, and Catechist/Literacy Educator. There are Twelve (12) lay staff serving in these roles: 1 Secretary, 1 Accountant, 2 Bus Drivers, 1 Health Officer, 2 Literacy Educators/Street Workers, 1 Minder/Street Worker, 1 Day Security, 1 Night Security, 1 House Mother/Children Cook and 1 Kitchen Helper. They accompany the children through their rehabilitation/reformation process.

- So far, 884 children in street situations have been admitted to live in the Centre since 2008.
- The Centre opened its doors to the children on the 4th of October 2005 from the Cathedral.
- 26 former residents have gone to different Universities in Nigeria, amongst them a graduate Nurse now on internship.
- 6 former residents are currently studying at the University of Port Harcourt and at Rivers State University, Nigeria.
- There are 3 waiting to write the Joint Admission and Matriculation Board (JAMB) Examination to get admission into the university.
- 84 of them trained in different vocational skills like Catering, Tailoring, Welding, Shoemaking, Hair-dressing/Make-up, Generator Mechanic, Barbing etc. Many of them are now self-employed and are contributing as productive members of the society. A number of these former residents visit De Marillac Centre a few times annually to give back (both in cash and kind), in gratitude for the care, guidance and training they received at the Center.

Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross is one of the most simple, yet powerful, ways to prayerfully walk alongside Jesus and encounter him like never before.

There are fourteen Stations of the Cross. Each is an invitation to contemplate and experience a pivotal moment from Jesus' sentencing to his death to his burial. Pray with us this Lenten season.
