VICE PRESIDENT OF MISSION ADVANCEMENT

Dear Friends,

I was standing in my kitchen next to my wife, while she wrestled a toddler in her arms. We were surrounded by our five other children, all of us transfixed and huddled around the small computer monitor streaming the drama unfolding halfway across the world at St. Peter's Basilica. I was utterly captivated watching the Holy Father, donning a red mozzetta and papal stole, emerge for the first time. But it was the emotion on Pope Leo XIV's face that really caught my attention. While he stood on the balcony, waiting for the crowd's thunderous cheers to quiet down, it seemed like a myriad of emotions swept across his countenance. And who could blame him? The man had woken up that morning as a relatively unknown Cardinal named Robert and was now a household name for billions of people, not to mention the spiritual father and servant leader of the universal Church. And yet, there he stood, embracing his new flock.

It had been exactly one week since Pope Leo XIV stepped onto the balcony overlooking St. Peter's Square. For many in the Church, the past seven days have been a mix of excitement and conjecture regarding the 267th successor of Peter. In the past week, I've heard people attempt to predict his top priorities and agenda for the Church, while others have mused about how he may prefer his Chicago deep-dish pizza. And while I admit it is fun to speculate about what Pope Leo may do or say next, my mind keeps returning to that balcony, to that moment when the first American pope stepped out before the Church and the

entire world for the first time.

There, in my crowded kitchen, I felt something stir – not just admiration for our new pope but a sense of mission. At that moment, the Church was unified. More than that, it was alive, buzzing with excitement and expectation. I sense that this is the beginning of a surge of hope and courage resounding at the heart of the Church's mission to the world. A new default disposition for the believer....

With the papacy of Pope Leo XIV comes an invitation not just to observe, but to engage. Moments like these remind us that the Church is alive, infused with the Holy Spirit, and rooted in Christ, whose life, death, and resurrection are the foundation of the Church's identity and mission. Receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion, we are intimately united to Christ Jesus and become living tabernacles of his love in the world. In a sense, that is why the Eucharistic Revival and this newsletter exist: to continue stoking the flames of truth and reminding us that God is still at work in the Church and in the world.

So, as we begin this new chapter in the life of the Church, let us continue to pray for our Holy Father and our Church. With eagerness and purposefulness, as Pope Leo invited us last week, let us "all walk together towards that homeland that God has prepared for us."

Parish Fiscal Year Ending

We budgeted \$303,000 for stewardship this fiscal year, a decrease of 2% from last year and 4.5 % from the year before. Right now we're at \$239,610.

In order to reach our budgeted goal we will need \$63,390 by the end of June, or \$10,565 each of the next 6 weeks. In June of 2019, almost \$68,000 came in the office for stewardship. It can happen!


