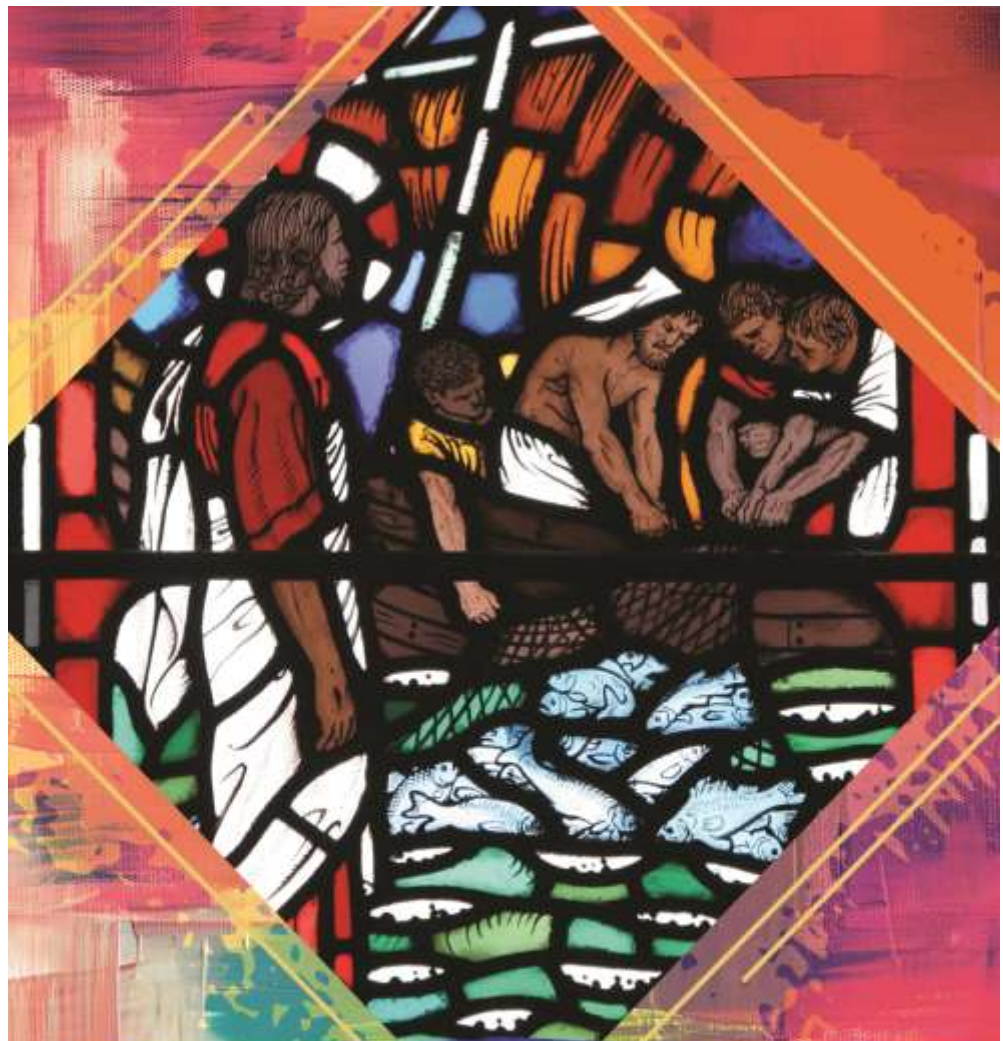

## words on *The Word*

by Father Amadi

I remember how I hardly slept the night before my first communion, for sheer excitement. Truth be told, I was also nervous, since I had been given the responsibility of proclaiming the Second Reading for that Mass. That would be the first time I ever read in Church. I was ten years old and it was the custom at my home parish at the time for the first communicants to do the readings at their First Communion Mass. For some reason, the catechist asked me and one of the girls in my class (who went on to become a catholic nun with whom I am still in contact) to read. We did not volunteer. We were simply chosen for the task, and I did everything I could to get out of it to no avail.

The reading must have gone well because from that day, people around the parish **would point at me as “that boy” who read at Mass.** My parents were very proud.

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life which means that it is at the heart of who we are and what we do as church. The Catechism **calls it the “efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the people of God by which the church is kept in being.”**

**The Eucharist is God’s self-gift** for the spiritual nourishment and life of the world. Our faith teaches that when the faithful worthily partake of the Eucharist, their spiritual hunger is sated. They experience a deep and abiding intimacy and communion with God. But what does it mean to worthily partake of the Eucharist? Surely that does not mean that we have to be perfect or sinless to partake of this sacrificial meal, the body and blood of Christ.



Shortly before holy communion, the priest silently utters this humble prayer: **“May the receiving of your Body and Blood, Lord Jesus Christ, not bring me to judgment and condemnation, but through your loving mercy, be for me protection in mind and body and a healing remedy.”** **Who needs this healing remedy?** A broken world and a hurting church made up of men and women who are fragile, wounded and weak.

Each spring when I celebrate first communion masses, I watch with a smile as the first communicants approach the altar for the first time. Some remember what their catechists and teachers taught them about how to fold their hands and **how to respond to the priest’s words “body of Christ,” and others, not so much.**

Some walk with confident strides with their parents in tow, others, timidly approach not daring to make eye contact even as their moms or dads reassured them that all would be well. But they keep walking. For me, this is a useful metaphor for the pilgrim church. Now that I am a priest, first communions Mass remain special. This is because observing the children never fails to remind me of my excitement and nervousness years ago when I received the Eucharist at my own First Communion.

**For Christ’s sacrificial meal, the Holy Eucharist that is food for the journey, we give thanks.**
