words on The Word

Patrick J. Boyle, S.J: In Memoriam

Continued from last week....

When I lost my father shortly after my ordi-nation to the priesthood, Father Boyle went out of his way to send me the kindest and most thoughtful note in which he not only offered to celebrate a Mass for my father, but also shared his own experience grieving the loss of his own parents and how the love of good friends and family was such

a comfort. His gesture of kindness and support made a deep and lasting impression. I was deeply moved and touched.

Attending one of his Masses, which he celebrated very early on Saturday mornings (the one day in the week when seminarians do not have to attend the scheduled Mass for the day but can go to any neighboring parish for Mass) was a profound spiritual encounter with Christ who obviously was the center of his life and the foundation of his priesthood. He was deeply absorbed in it and totally present to it. Watching him celebrate Mass, we learned to love the Mass. We heard a story that he once told his Jesuit provincial who was visiting him at the semi-nary. He told him that he had a confession to make. Understandably, the provincial was worried and did not know what to make of this situation. His confession, though, was that he was "addicted to the Mass." One can only imagine the provincial's sigh of relief. Although he spent much of his priesthood in the formation of diocesan priests, Father Boyle loved the Society of Jesus

and was exceedingly proud to be a Jesuit. I remember one afternoon, at our lunch table where we were engaged in a lively debate about the merits or lack

thereof of a book we were using for a class in Trinitarian theology.

The book, "The Trinity: An Introduction to Catholic Doctrine on the Triune God," was written by Gilles Emery, an unknown (at least in America) Swiss theologian who at the time was appointed to the International Theological Commission in Rome. Father

Boyle who was walking past, asked what the fuss was all about. When he heard it was about Gilles Emery's book, he asked if he was "one of ours" namely, whether he was

a Jesuit. When we told him Emery was a Dominican, he smiled as he said, "Ahhh

he must not be that good then" and kept walking. The principal celebrant and homilist at Father Boyle's funeral was his personal friend, fellow moral theologian, former military chaplain and former colleague at the Mundelein Seminary faculty, Archbishop Jerome Listecki of the Milwaukee Archdiocese. His homily, which was eloquent and heartfelt, was a true testament to a long and genuine friendship between two churchmen who have devoted their lives to service to God and country. Noting Father Boyle's love for the Mass, the Archbishop observed that there was no need for a Eucharistic Revival for Pat Boyle as love for the Eucharist was an ever-present reality in his priesthood. Suffused with rib-cracking humor and profound spiritual insights as is fitting for the funeral of a priest who loved life and who lived for others as Father Boyle did, the homily was both touching and memorable. Listening to Fathers Brendan Lupton and Marek Duran from the seminary faculty, who were close friends of Pat Boyle's share a few words of remembrance at the end of Mass, was both heartwarming and inspiring as they told a few more Father Boyle stories. He was undoubtedly a remarkable priest, a man of deep faith,

> a wise confessor and an outstanding Jesuit priest. It is our fervent hope that generations of young priests and former students will be inspired by the greatness of soul, wonderful humanity, generosity,

humor and love that was abundantly manifested in the life and priesthood of Patrick J. Boyle, S.J. On All Souls Day especially, one of my masses will be for the happy repose of my beloved professor, Father Patrick J. Boyle, SJ.

Requiescat in Pace, Amen.




