A few months ago, the parishes of the Diocese of Green Bay received the document Norms and Guidelines for the Diocesan Practice of Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion. This document affirms much of what we do as a parish and individuals in the Mass.

What is the proper disposition for receiving Holy Communion?

First, there is the need to quiet one's mind, heart, and lips prior to Mass. Even before arriving at Church, it is desirable to spend time in prayer at home, especially with the readings for the day. Try to arrive at Mass early. You are highly encouraged to be quiet before Mass. This is for both our own preparation and as a courtesy to others who are preparing. Silence is an important thing that allows God to speak to us. This silence should only be broken for the pre-Mass announcements, preludes or the praying of the rosary.

Second, we are to fast from food and drink for at least one hour before Holy Communion. Note, this is before Holy Communion, not before the Mass. Exceptions are made for water and medicine.

Third, it is highly encouraged that a person go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) regularly, so as to come to the Eucharist with a clear conscience. What does regular Reconciliation look like? If one has committed a grave sin, one should try as soon as possible to go to Reconciliation. If one is not aware of grave sin, getting on a regular schedule of Reconciliation such as once a month or once every other month is a good practice.

Fourth, "the faithful may not receive Holy Communion when guilty of grave sin" or when in gravely sinful life situations. In extraordinary circumstances, one may receive communion in a state of grave sin if one has made a perfect Act of Contrition. Then one must resolve to go to Confession as soon as one is able. An example of such an extraordinary situation is being physically unable to make it to Reconciliation before Mass.

Fifth, those unable to receive Holy Communion for whatever reason are encouraged to pray a Spiritual Communion. In this prayer, we invite Jesus into our hearts to be strengthened even when we cannot receive him sacramentally.

What is the Diocese asking us to do in regards to how we receive Holy Communion?

First, we are to make a bow before we receive Holy Communion. This is a quick bow that shows our belief that Jesus is present in the consecrated host and gives him reverence. This is done as the person in front of us is receiving Holy Communion.

Second, we receive the consecrated host from the minister. This can either be done in the hands or on the tongue. If you receive in the hands, make a "throne" for Jesus with your non-dominant hand on top and your dominant hand on the bottom. After the minister says the "Body of Christ," say "Amen" in affirmation. Then pick up the consecrated host with your dominant hand, and place it on your tongue before moving. Then, you are free to move on. The goal of being so precise about this is to eliminate people walking off with Holy Communion and receiving while walking away.

If you receive on the tongue, when the minister says the "Body of Christ," say "Amen" in affirmation. While keeping your hands folded, open your mouth wide enough and have your tongue slightly out. The minister will place the consecrated host on your tongue. Then you are free to move on. Thank you very much for reading this article and trying to put into effect what is being asked of you. Most of what we are doing is correct and this is just some minor changes to ensure the safety and reverence for Holy Communion. We are all growing in this, even the priests.

We are to come to the Eucharist with clean consciences and properly disposed souls. We are challenged by the Lord Jesus Christ not just to merely receive Holy Communion, but that our reception should be fruitful. Having the proper disposition will help us.

Corpus Christi Procession

Next Sunday join us for the Corpus Christ procession immediately following the 10 am Mass at Holy Rosary as we celebrate the Eucharist as the body of Christ. The solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ, historically known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi, celebrates the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist – Body, Soul, and Divinity.
