Happy New Year!

Pictured below are the Confirmation students who are preparing to be Confirmed in Fall of 2026. The group meets once per month at the Parish Life Center in Kiel from 6:00 - 8:50 approximately. This is a great group of kids; I have found our classes so far to be very productive and quite enjoyable. Our classes begin with a meal. We are still in need of volunteers to sign up for the April meal and one summer meal. The students have assignments that are completed at home along with online learning and of course the in person 36 hours. The students will also attend a one-day Confirmation Retreat at Mount Tabor in Menasha on April 12th. We also have a wonderful opportunity with Bishop Ricken which we will be attending on March 22nd.

Everything listed in this article is part of our required hours or Confirmation Prep Requirements. This means any classes or events that are missed will need to be made up to ensure hours and requirements are met.

So far, the students have chosen their Confirmation Saint which is also going to be their Confirmation Name. The discussion was initiated by learning how people become Saints; are they Martyrs or do they have miracles attributed to them. They also learned about the lengthy Canonization process. Students were instructed to research Saints and chose a Saint that they had something in common with, a Saint that is a patron Saint of something they are passionate about. Saints are chosen during the week of All Saints Day; the plan is for students to pray to their Saint as they prepare for Confirmation. Students along with their sponsors will attend a Sponsor Retreat at H.R. in May.

The students are currently working on choosing a sponsor. Sponsors also have a list of requirements such as, the obvious receipt of Sacraments, active participation in their Parish, and are a practicing Catholic who adheres to the Church teachings such as Mass attendance, attending Reconciliation at least once per year etc.




