

Deacon's Diary

When I was growing up, looking back on that time now, I believe I was blessed to have the most wonderful parents anyone could ask for. My Dad was a rather quiet man who taught us how to work hard on our farm **but didn't share much about his life except his example about how to live life well.** I think that he could have been comfortable living silently as a monk in a remote monastery. But then he **wouldn't have had nine children.**

Mom, however, was always there to answer any questions about family or life that a child of any age would ask. Some of the questions that this child needed to know about pertained to knowing more about either of my grandfathers who died before I was born. For some reason I just felt that knowing the mystery behind that part of my roots would help me discover my true identity. And she was able to solve that mystery for me which seemed very difficult for her to share the story about her father because his life did not end well. But knowing how his life ended helped me to see at a certain point in my life; I was turning into that grandfather.

In everyone's life, that same mystery as well as the desire to know more about our roots exists; to know more about the God who we are told created us. Truly we have been shown what others throughout the ages have portrayed what He looks like through art, songs, and Sacred Scripture. But if we stop there and leave it at that, we will either take Him for granted or start creating Him in our own image. So that perception of our loving God must be a daily encounter with Him by all ways and means, (prayer, scripture, Sacraments, His Son, His Spouse). Yes, His Spouse, our Spiritual Mother, Mary.

Yes, even though that concept of someone crossing that chasm from the other **side of life was described as "impossible" by Jesus Himself in His Parable of "The rich man and Lazarus," (Lk. 16:19-31)** God loves us so much that He has sent His beloved Mary back to us many times in history. Specifically, Guadalupe, Mexico in 1531, Lourdes, France in 1858, and Fatima, Portugal in 1917 to

name a few. Today we are in a period of the history of mankind, when God has allowed Mary, the Mother of His Son, to cross that chasm every single day for 44 years and five **months. Yes, that's right and that is unprecedented.** It's never happened before.

I have been following these events for about thirty-five years that have been happening daily in a small village called Medjugorje in Bosnia-Herzegovina of Eastern Europe. For almost 35 years I have eagerly awaited to read the monthly message our Blessed Mother leaves for us on the 25th of each month, to open our eyes to how much God and Jesus love us. By now one would think that my life would be perfect. Yet I am still Human and fall. In 1994, my wife Cheryl and I went there on a pilgrimage led by a man named Wayne Weible who has authored several books about those events from his personal experiences going there.

The author of those books has since passed away, but on December 7th, 2025, his wife Judith has been invited to speak to the people of our three linked parishes. She will speak after the 10:00 Mass at SS Peter & Paul, and again at the second location of Good Shepherd Parish in Chilton on Monday, December 8th after the 5:30 PM Mass. She is coming to share with us the urgency of this time in our history when we will have to make a choice. We will need to decide if we are going to continue the path we are on or to take our gift of our faith more seriously.

Mary is giving ten 'secrets' to those six "visionaries" she has been appearing to for forty-four plus years. When all six have the ten 'secrets', she will stop appearing to them and 'The Secrets' will start to occur. Currently, three of them have all ten and three have nine secrets. No one except the visionaries know what they are, but we are **told the first three will be "Great Warnings."** In Mary's own words she tells us: **"Don't wait for the secrets to start happening to change your life. Because by then, it will be too late."** We hope to see you all then. Meanwhile, listen to your Mother, Mary.

Advent Reconciliation Service

Our three linked parishes will be hosting a communal celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Thursday, December 4, beginning at 6 pm at SS. Peter & Paul Parish. The evening will begin with a brief service, followed by time for individual celebration of the sacrament (both screen and face to face available). Several priests will be present. All are invited and welcomed to come and prepare your heart for Jesus.

Season Your Faith Series

Thank you to all who attended the November 1st organ concert at Ss. Peter and Paul.

Our next program in the Season Your Faith Series takes place on Sunday, December 7 after the 10 am Mass. Judith Weible will speak on the apparitions at Medjugorje. A light brunch will be served after Mass and she will begin her talk at noon.

Mass will be celebrated at Holy Rosary at 8:30 am and at SS. Peter & Paul at 6:30 pm on Monday, December 8. It is a holy day of obligation.

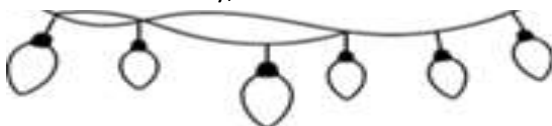
