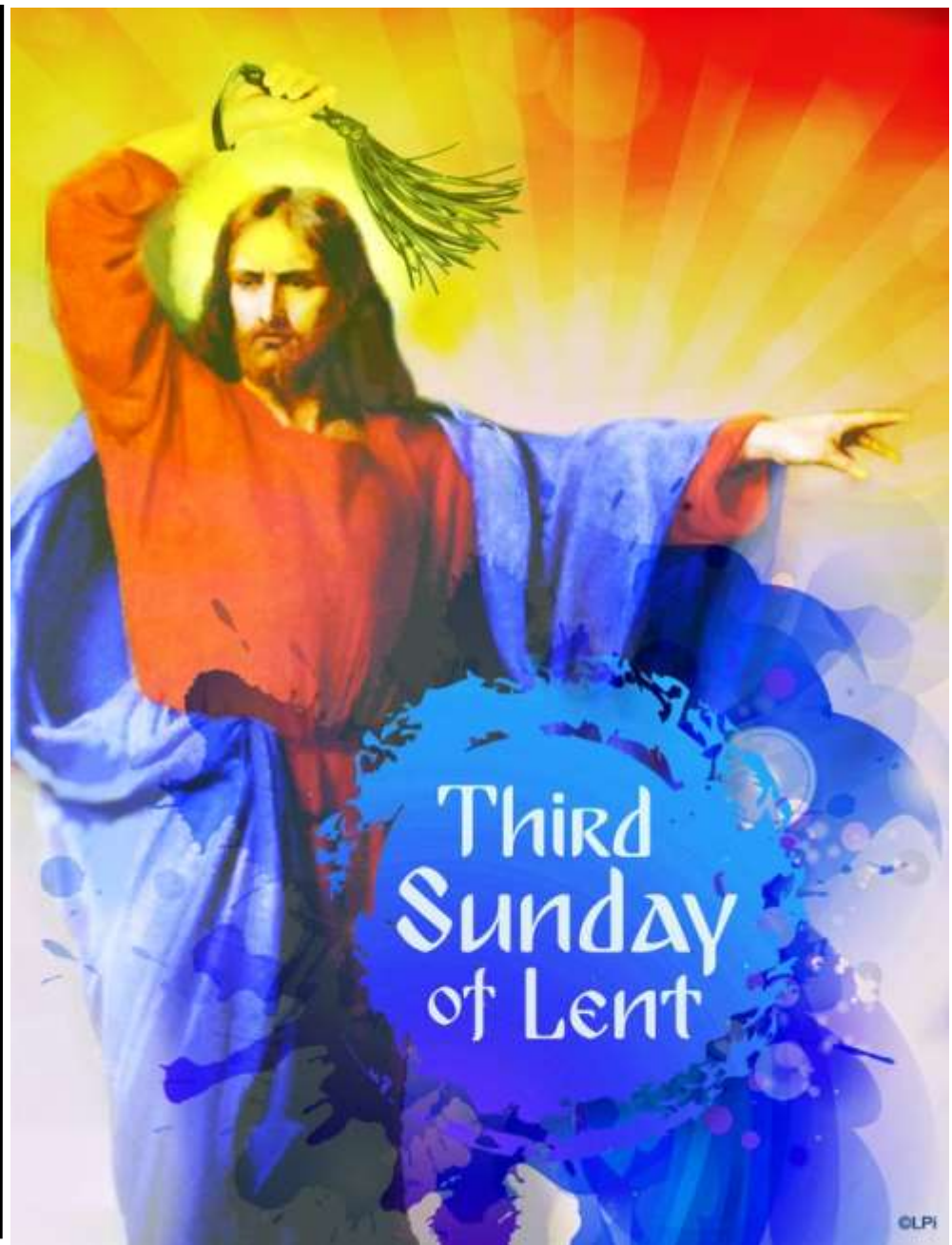

From the Principal's Pen

Like many of you, as a child I remember my parents, teachers, and other adults **telling me about different rules: don't run in the hallway, use "please" and "thank you," and eat your vegetables.** Often, those words would go in one ear and right out the other. However, what I do remember much more clearly are the actions of those adults.

For example, when I was about 11 years old, I was walking with my father in the parking lot of a hardware store, getting supplies for his work. A woman across the lot was visibly upset, struggling with a flat tire. My father paused, walked over, spoke with her, and then had me help him change it for her. The woman was grateful and offered money for our help. I was all ready to grab it, but my father told her to keep it and wished her a good day.

I was reminded of this as Father read the gospel at our school mass last Tuesday. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus reminds us of the importance of practicing what **we preach. He says in Matthew 23:3, "Do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but do not practice."** As we journey through this Lent, it's essential that we remember the importance of living out the values we teach our **children and students. Matthew's** gospel challenges us to model that authentic discipleship for our children, ensuring that our actions align with the teachings we espouse.

Just as Jesus reproached the Pharisees for focusing on external appearances while neglecting what was truly important, we too must be mindful of how our behavior impacts the children in our care. Our children look to us not only for guidance in academics but also for lessons **in kindness, integrity, and humility. It's**

through our daily actions—our words, decisions, and interactions—that we teach them how to live out their Catholic faith with authenticity and love. By practicing what we preach, we help our **children understand that faith isn't just something we talk about—it's some-thing we live.**

As we continue to nurture the minds and hearts of our young learners at Divine Savior and the parishes, let us commit to living as true examples of Christ's love and mercy. Our children are watching us, and they will learn more from what we do than what we say. In our classrooms, homes, and at church, let us strive to be the living examples of the values we hope to instill. Together, we can make our faith real and tangible, showing our children that living as true disciples of Christ is the most important lesson they will ever learn.

Thanks to the volunteers who came in to help beforehand behind the scenes and those who helped that day; coleslaw & tartar sauce makers, potato preparers, bread butterers, torte cutters, order takers, delivery drivers, fish fryers, bag stuffers and servers. And thanks to the confirmation class who came to help in the serving line. We couldn't do it without each one of you.

Thanks also to those who made tortes. We had about 50 tortes to serve and sold out by 6 pm.

The majority of the food was donated. That's amazing! Schoenborn's Jewelry donated the to go containers for our tartar sauce, coleslaw, desserts and the fish fries. Badger's Den, Millhome Supper Club & The Altona also donated supplies for that day. Special thanks to Premier Financial who donated a fish plate to all the residents at Field of Dreams and Sycamore Lodge. We are grateful for the community support!

Donations from our parishioners of \$1,195 came in to help with the cost of the fish, which was just over \$4,500. Thank you!

Our profit was approximately \$10,000 and goes right into the parish budget. **WOW!**

Raise the Roof – Holy Rosary School



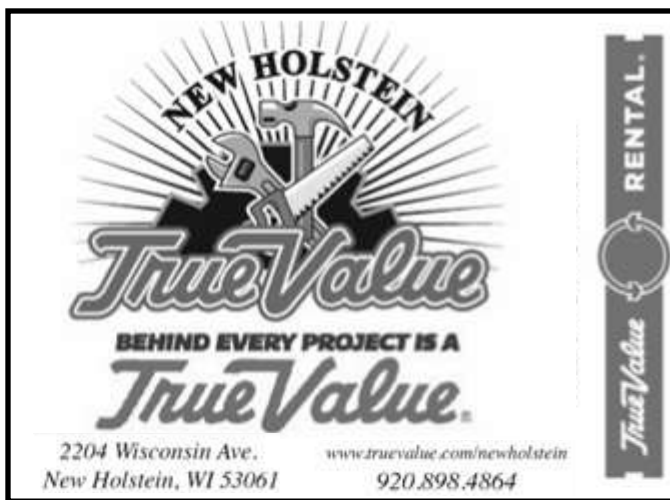
