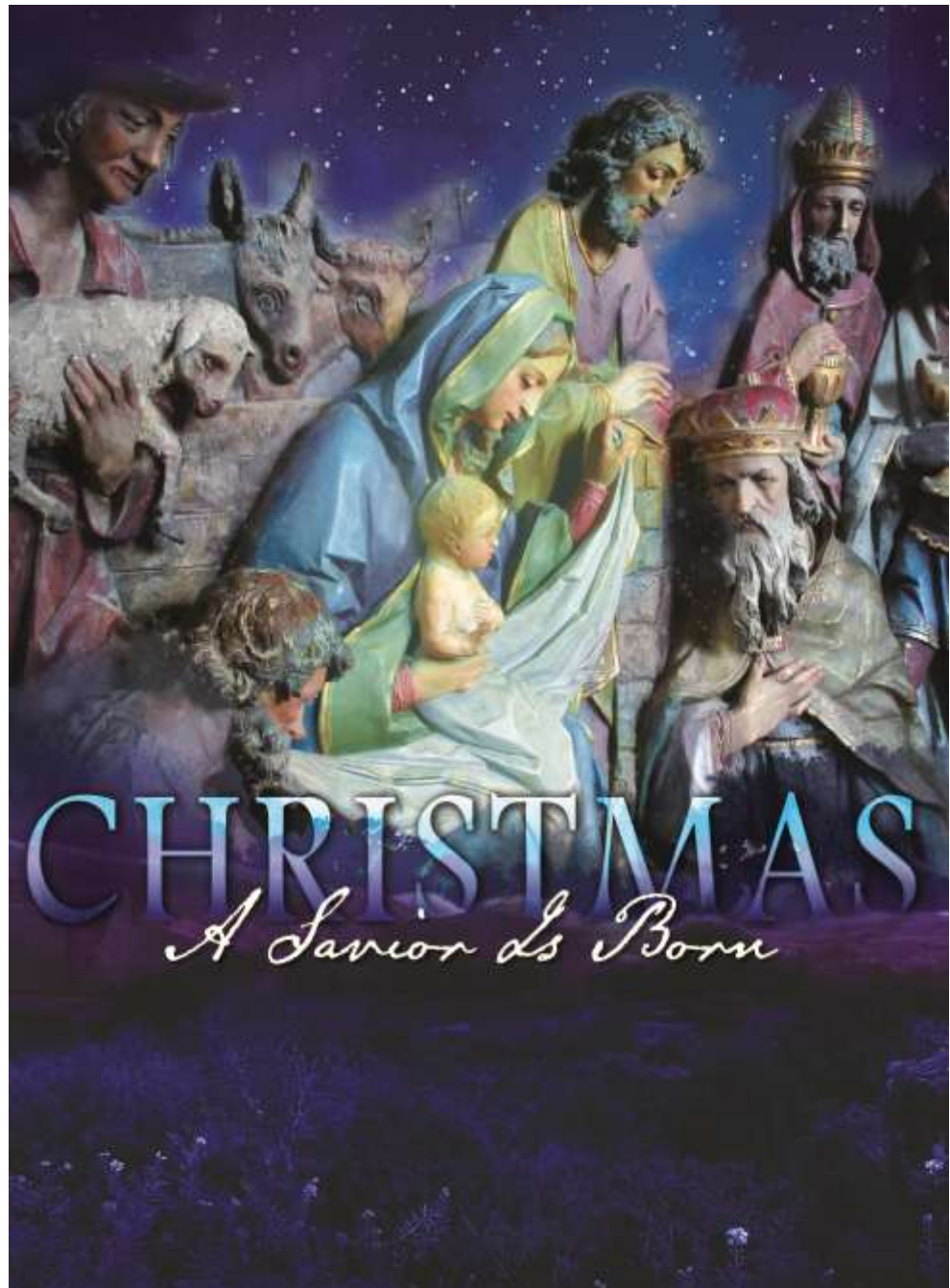

From the Principal's Pen

At the end of our Christmas concert this past Tuesday evening, the students sang **"Silent Night" as the lights were dimmed** and each held a lit candle in their hands. Their voices echoed through the darkness of the church, touching the ears and hearts of all present. As the song concluded, I began reflecting on what I experienced.

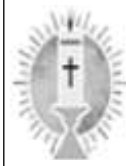
Holy Communion for the Homebound
