Contract the second state of the second state

Some of the most difficult things we face in our lives are sickness and death. We try to understand it. We pray for healing, but there are times we feel all alone and wonder where God is during these times.

In the Gospel this weekend we see Jesus going with a few of his disciples to **the home of Peter. Peter's mother**-in-law was sick in bed and through the touch of Jesus, she was healed. What did she do immediately after that? She got up and waited on Jesus!

Many people flocked to Jesus and the ministry of his disciples, who were then healed of their maladies. There are many ways we can be in need of healing, physically, psychologically and spiritually.

While many saw with their own eyes the physical healings Jesus performed, Jesus is always more interested in seeing everyone healed spiritually and choosing to follow Him.

In our first reading we hear from Job who calls life a drudgery. Job cannot sleep or find peace in his life after all the turmoil he has gone through. He does not see an end to his problems and becomes hopeless.

We see this in many people these days who are suffering from many issues from sicknesses to broken relationships to economic issues. What help can we glean from the Book of Job to help us with our issues today? Job lost everything! But he remained faithful to God.

What was Job's response? He was devastated, but proclaimed, "The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away blessed be the name of the Lord!" Why are some people healed and some are not? Do our prayers matter? Does God even hear us?

Yes, our prayers matter and God hears every single one of them. Our biggest challenge is to remain faithful in these times of greatest need. When we come together to pray, we form community and find strength in each other. We heal when we help each other, we come closer to God as we work together.

We will never understand where all of this suffering comes from, why it happens to some people and not to others. Remaining faithful is what we are asked to do. This life is short when we think of it in terms of eternity. Being refined in **the fire of God's love can be painful. Our** help comes from the Lord who made heaven and earth.

Just as Peter's mother waited on Jesus as soon as she was healed, we too have to constantly come to Jesus and pray for healing, physically, emotionally and most of all spiritually. "Blessed be the name of the Lord!"
