Deacon's Perspective

How's your Lenten Journey progressing? Have you been following the Lenten Practices in terms of Almsgiving, Fasting, and Prayer? These three pillars of Lent are meant for us to develop a closer relationship with God, so that ultimately, we can give God all the Glory. These 40 days of Lent should be filled with reflection, service, and prayer.

I frequently ask a question whether I'm preaching, or visiting a classroom, or working with an RCIA catechumen or candidate; which is "Do you love God?" It's a challenging question to try and answer, but we should take solace in knowing that God loves us unconditionally! And if God loves us unconditionally, then we in turn, should try and return that love back to God.

How do we know tangibly that God loves us? The first image that should capture our attention as we walk into church is the large Crucifix hanging in each of our churches. Clearly, this is one of the greatest visual reminder of God's Love for us, and if you haven't, I would highly recommend that you sit and reflect on the magnitude of Jesus' sacrifice of His entire Person for each of us. Another visible and awesome reminder, which is the source and summit of our faith is the Eucharist! God truly present in our lives if we only take the time to fully recognize His overwhelming Love. There are many other visible reminders of God's love for us, and I hope you are able to ponder how often, and where has God revealed His love for you.

In previous articles I have quoted the Servant of God, Luisa Piccarreta, and some of her writings, given to her from Jesus Christ. The following one is especially poignant not only for Lent but also for us to understand how much we are

loved by God. Jesus said to her:

"I am continuously involved in all human action, be it a thought, a breath, or a brief movement. However, people never think of my feeling toward them, and they do not undertake their actions for me. Rather they attribute to themselves what they do. Oh if they would think of my continuous concern for them, they would not use what is mine in detriment to my glory, and in detriment to their well-being!"

So, I ask again, how is your Lenten journey progressing? We are just past the mid-point of Lent with approximately two weeks remaining, which means you still have time. The words to Luisa Piccarreta from Jesus are fitting, in which he said:

"A person should do all for Me and offer it to Me, because everything that is done for Me I keep on record, to return to them in the next life." "On the other hand, all that is done for Me cannot enter into Me because it is not worthy of Me. Even though it has taken place with my accompaniment – due to my continuous involvement in all human actions".

The purpose of Lent is for us to grow closer to God using the three pillars mentioned above; Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. God wants us to return to Him, and turn away from distractions that keep our hearts away Him. So, let us "love the Lord God with all our heart, and with all of our soul, and with all of our mind, and with all of our strength".

(Mark 12:30-31)
