

"Here I am Lord, I come to do your will." This is the Psalm Response we sing this weekend from Psalm 40, a Psalm of Thanksgiving. It reminds us of the readings this week from the first book of Samuel where Hannah enters the Temple and prays for a son. There are many times we pray asking the Lord to hear our needs and answer them. Do we remember to thank the Lord when we receive what we asked for?

Psalm 40 could be that prayer of Thanksgiving we could sing:
"I have waited, waited for the Lord, and

he stooped toward me and heard my cry. And he put a new song into my mouth, a hymn to our God."

Hannah's prayers were heard and answered and the Lord sent a son to Hannah and her husband, Elkanah. They returned to the Temple and dedicated their son, Samuel to the Lord, leaving him there under the care of Eli.

Today's first reading shares the story of Samuel as a young boy hearing a calling from God, but unaware of where this voice is coming from, he goes repeatedly to Eli, thinking it was he who was calling him. Finally realizing it was the Lord, Samuel answers, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

How often does God try to reach us by calling us to give of ourselves in many different ways, and we don't know that these small voices within our hearts are calls from the Lord?

In our Gospel today we see the interaction of John the Baptist and Jesus. John recognizes Jesus as the One who was to come after him. This Jesus John proclaims, is the Lamb of God! The first disciples heard the preachings of John and immediately

turned their attention to Jesus following him as one follows a teacher or rabbi.

Andrew was one of these disciples who upon hearing the words of Jesus and remembering all he had learned about the coming of the Messiah believed that this man Jesus was the awaited Messiah. He quickly goes to seek out his brother Simon to tell him. Simon returns to listen to Jesus who changes his name to Cephas, which is translated to Peter, meaning "rock."

God continues to call disciples to Himself today. Bishop David Ricken has heard this call for more disciples and has shared his vision of Missionary Disciples with our Diocese through the "Entrust Program." January 2024 Deacons Deli

Recently the Vatican released what is known as Fiducia Supplicans? What is this? What does this mean for us? Deacon's Pat and Dennis will have a discussion about this latest document on Thursday, January 18 at 5:30 at Hilde's Deli, Chilton.

If you are unaware, a few weeks ago, the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, published the declaration *Fiducia Supplicans* ('Supplicating Trust'), which has caused a lot of noise in the media, both secular and Catholic.

Amidst all this noise there was often minimal relevant conversation about the actual content of the document or the perennial theology that the document explicated. The document was intended to develop a deeper appreciation of the pastoral meaning of simple blessings.

Then a clarification was issued January 4th that was made as a result of the diversity of reactions and pastoral implementation of this development. There is a clear reiteration that this development in no way changes Church teaching on the Sacrament of Marriage and sexuality, contrary to many news reports and social media posts.

We will also have Bishop David Ricken's Letter of reaction to this latest document as well. Come and join us for an interesting, but also a respectful conversation concerning how we are to proceed as a people of God.



Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why do we make changes in the Mass? Some seem so small and unimportant. Are they really necessary?

Answer:

The celebration of the Eucharist is at the heart of our identity as Catholics. Our purpose as a Church community revolves around the Eucharist. Everything we are and everything we do is measured not only by how well we celebrate, but also by how well we live the sacrament. If that is so, then we as a community will always strive to celebrate the Mass as best we can. The reasons for some changes might seem more obvious than others, but there is a reason behind each

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal is the introduction to the Missal that contains all the prayers for the celebration of the Mass. The Order of Mass we use now was issued in 1975 and, as often happens over the course of years, some questions have come up about the proper way of doing some things and whether or not other practices are acceptable. These changes clarify some things and make the celebration of the Mass more meaningful for everyone.

The opportunity is presented to us to better learn and understand each part of the Mass, which in turn should help us deepen our appreciation for its beauty and meaning. We will be a better Church if we have a clearer understanding and knowledge of Who and what we celebrate.




