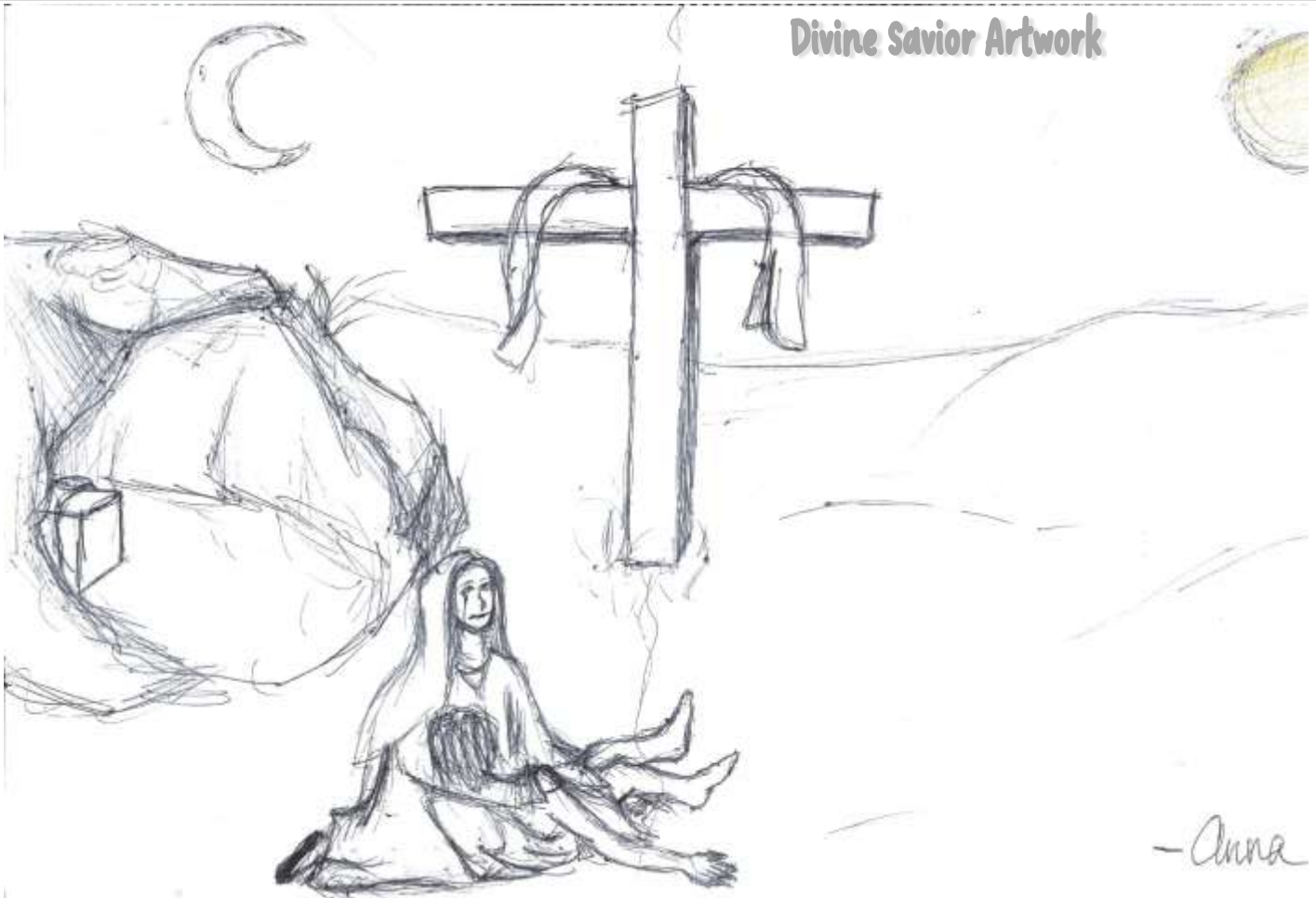

Deacon's Diary

Easter Sunday

Some of you may know that a group of men gather from our three linked parishes along with some others from Good Shepherd Parish of Chilton, on Saturday mornings at 7:30. We come together in **Holy Rosary's "Mary, Queen of Peace Room" to pray and watch a 30 minute segment** about different aspects of our faith produced by **"That Man Is You"** (TMIY). We then have a 20-to-30-minute discussion and faith sharing about the questions at the end. The subject during this season is about the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary and is filmed in the Holy Land on the actual sites where those mysteries took place. This past session we watched was about the fifth Sorrowful Mystery, the Crucifixion.

Now some of you may remember from reading or from a past homily you heard, that in the Passover meal, of which the Lord was celebrating with His Apostles at the Last Supper, there are prescribed rituals that must be followed. One of the rituals is to take a drink of wine after eating certain things. There should be a total of four drinks of wine, but if you look to the scripture that describes the Last Supper, Jesus only took the wine three times.

Now, move to the gospel we will re-enact in the Passion, particularly the passion we

hear on Good Friday from John's Gospel.

Just after Jesus handed the care of His Mother over to His beloved Apostle John, **it says: "After this, aware that everything was now finished, in order that the scripture might be fulfilled, Jesus said, "I thirst."**

There was a vessel filled with common wine. So they put a sponge soaked in wine on a sprig of Hyssop and put it up to His mouth. When Jesus had taken the wine, he **said: "It is finished." And bowing His head,** He handed over the spirit.
