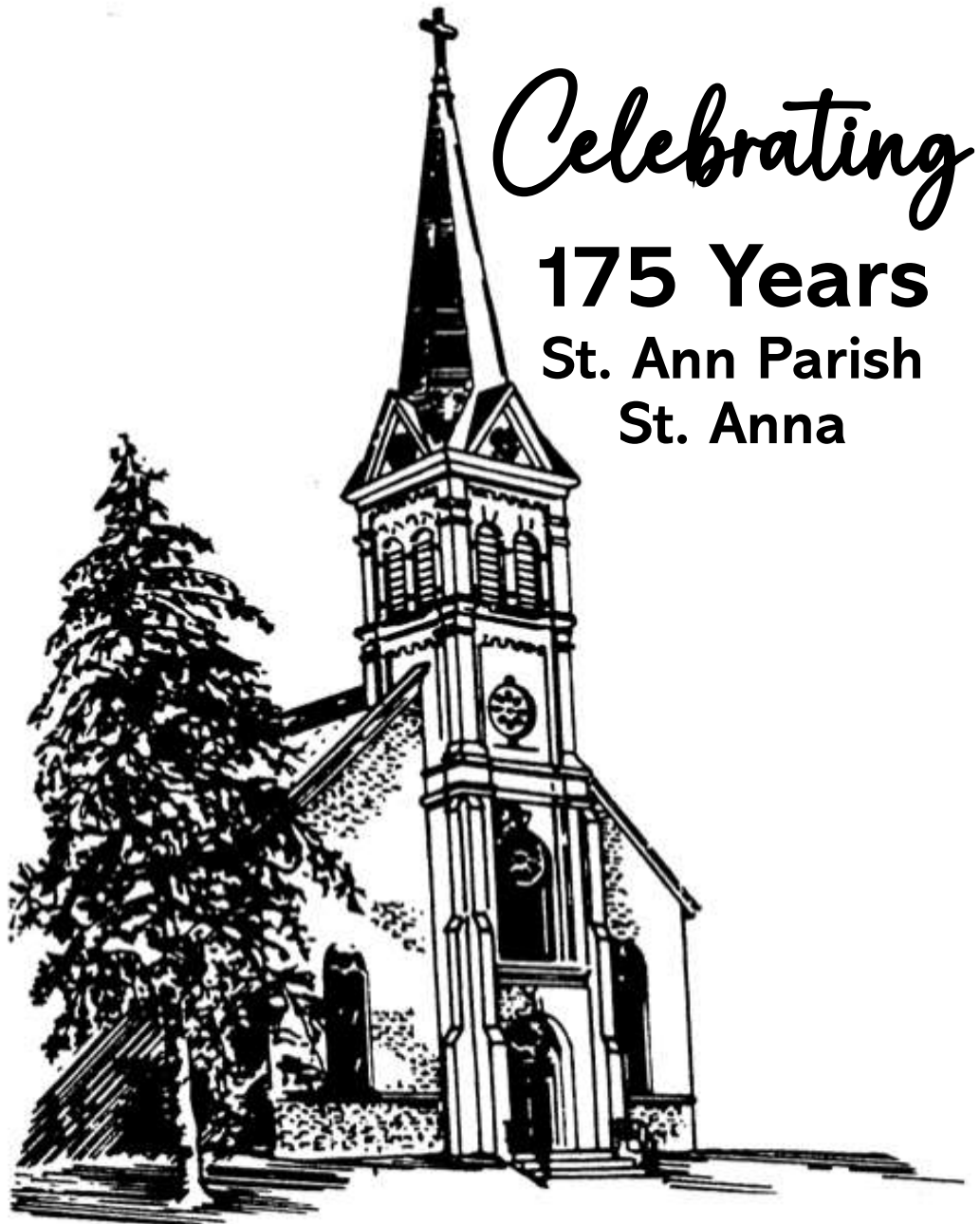

Deacon's Diary

The gospel selected for Trinity Sunday is remnant of those well-known scripture numbers we see many times at sporting events and other huge gatherings, "Jn 3:16." It starts out with: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but 'MIGHT' have eternal life." That word "might" has many implications in both directions, being saved or not saved.

There are some that [I believe,] see that as a 'given.' It is sometimes understood that all who believe in Him "WILL" have eternal life. "For God did not send Him into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him. Whoever believes in Him will not be condemned" ... Here's the thing. Maybe those who find it hard to believe in Him cannot do so because they haven't witnessed any of us who "do" believe in Him look or act any differently than those who don't.

I have heard it said many times by people who are searching for a church to join and have not grown up in any particular faith: "What do Catholics do?" "I want to join a church that puts their faith into action." "I want to be part of a faith that lives out the gospel." In other words, they want a community that practices something most of us heard about in our grade-school Catechism classes, the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy.

Now, wait a minute you might say. It's thanks to the Catholic Church that most of the hospitals and early universities were begun. We have those St. Vincent de Paul stores and food kitchens out there. But they reply: "Yes but what are the people in your pews doing?" I know that many of you are doing those things but are you inviting others into the trenches to help you. Are we giving others the chance to be "Christ" with you? Are we welcoming others even if they don't belong to our church?

Are we following those words of Moses from our first reading from the

book of Exodus: "a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger rich in kindness and fidelity. If I find favor with you oh Lord, do come along in our company. (But), this indeed is a stiff-necked people yet pardon our sins and receive us as your own." Let us walk with Him and invite others along with us.

Saint Paul's letter to the Corinthians this weekend gives us a path for doing that. "Brothers and sisters, rejoice. Mend your ways, encourage one another, agree with one another, live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the holy ones greet you." (Then), "the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, (will) be with you."

That, my brothers and sisters is what those who are seeking an active church to join are looking for. "AMEN?"

Worship & Meditation

I cannot emphasize this enough: please read and pray over the coming Sunday's Gospel before attending Mass. Your experience will be so much richer when you come prepared to hear the Word of God.

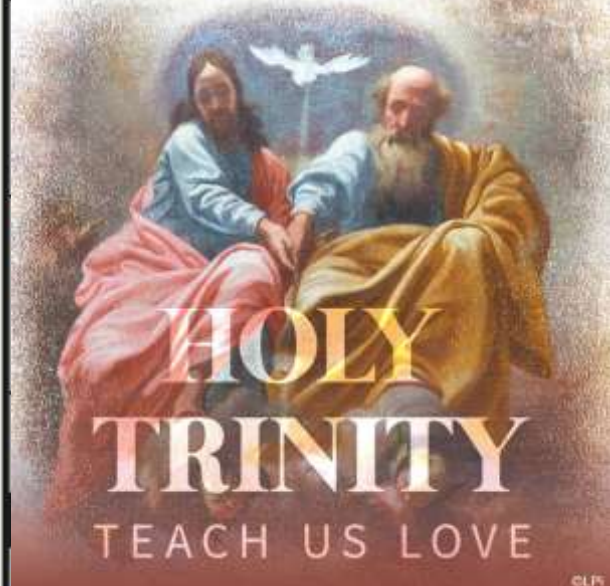
