From the Principal's Pen

Growing up, there had never been a shortage of family around me. My wife and I both come from large families, I being the eldest of five, she a middle child in a group of four; our extended families reaching high double digits. Family gatherings would consist of large crowds of cousins and copious amounts of food. sauce are homemade. We have a great selection of homemade tortes to choose from each year and they are \$2 extra.

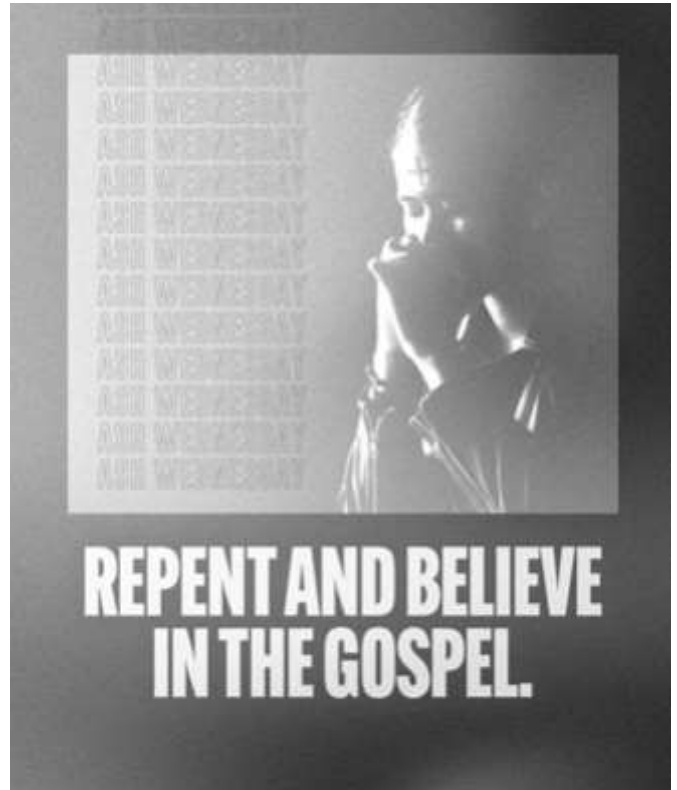

Raise the Roof – Holy Rosary School

It has recently come to our attention that the current school roof was improperly installed. Unfortunately, this is causing the roof to leak in multiple places and is damaging the interior of the building.

Consultants have inspected the damage and have provided recommendations to ensure a solution that is long-lasting. Several estimates have been obtained and reviewed by the fi-

nance and parish councils. After much discussion, a consensus was reached to remove the failed roof system and properly replace it.

We are looking to you, our parishioners and former Holy Rosary Catholic School families, to help fund this necessary project. The cost to complete the project is \$130,000. We have already received donations in the amount of \$90,000. We are reaching out to you to contribute towards the balance of \$40,000.
