

Images Matter

Pictures and Images have enormous power. They tell a story more effectively and poignantly than words alone. As a result, the messages contained in them resonate more deeply with our emotions and lodge themselves deeply in our consciousness. Often times, this happen without our being aware of it. As the 20th century American novelist Gore Vidal. notes, an image can stir the deepest fountains of feeling and emotion in the hearts of vast throngs, much more effectively than words alone. Great public speakers know this reality well and are skilled at the use of carefully chosen images to drive home their messages. As the old saying goes, "a picture is worth more than a thousand words."


Depending on the historical context, some pictures become emblematic of an era, a visual representation of a cause and thus become iconic. One thinks of photographs of the United States Marines raising the flag on Iwo Jima and of John-John Kennedy saluting his father's coffin. Pope Francis' embrace of a severely disfigured man early in his pontificate which delighted and warmed many hearts remains memorable. During the COVID pandemic, the photograph of the Pope striding up alone to the dais in an empty St. Peter's Square to lead a prayer service for an end to the pandemic, spoke volumes.

Not too long ago, the image of the lifeless body of Angie Valeria Martinez, a young immigrant girl from El Salvador, lying face down on the banks of the Rio Grande River beside the equally lifeless body of her father, Oscar Alberto Martinez, both of whom had drowned while trying to cross the southern border the United States, attracted wide condemnation as well as served as a painful reminder of the harsh reality of the migration crises affecting the United States. If these stories were

simply told without the accompanying images, they would neither have struck the same emotional chords nor resonated so powerfully with as many people.

The pre-eminent image of Christianity is the Crucifix, a visual representation of the price of our salvation. We contemplate the crucifix to remind ourselves that Christ the son of God truly died on the cross in order to save us from sin. As we pray in the liturgy, "dying he destroyed our death, rising he restored our life." On the cross, the Son of God was lifted up and spread wide his arms to embrace all people offering them pardon, mercy and salvation. "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert. so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3: 14-16).

Hence, for us Catholic Christians, there is no more powerful image than the Crucifix.



Lenten Reconciliation Service

The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart in June is my favorite Feast Day of the year. There are no expectations, only the opportunity to celebrate and marvel at the deep, gentle, complete love of Christ. I cannot tell you how many times in my life I have lost my temper, gossiped, overindulged, or been lazy. But I can promise you that every single time I have taken those sins to Jesus' Sacred Heart I have found only tenderness, love, and forgiveness. His Heart has been my refuge, my consolation, and my inspiration to love more purely, kindly, and generously. Jesus is the Lamb of God, on Whom has been laid the iniquity of us all, and sometimes the shame I feel over my sins makes me want to hide from Him. At times I cannot look Him in the eye. Instead I look Him in the Heart, where I find only Love. If you have avoided "looking Jesus in the eye," try looking to His Sacred Heart today. His tenderness, love, and forgiveness are waiting for you. 




