

It's Pentecost Sunday!!

But what is Pentecost, and what does it mean for us and the Church? Some refer to Pentecost as the birth of the Church.

The traditional explanation comes from the Gospel of St. John where Jesus says: "If you Love Me, you will keep My commandments. And I will give you another Advocate to be the 'Spirit of Truth', which neither the world cannot accept, because it neither sees it nor knows it. But you know it, because it remains with you, and I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you." (John 14:15:18)

In breaking down these passages just a bit; beauty emerges. When Jesus says, "if you Love Me", He means Love is not just words or interior feelings; authentic Love is manifested through action. These commands to which Christ refers comprise the entire Gospel message.

Advocate; literally means: "He who is called to one's side"; this is sometimes translated as 'counselor" The Holy Spirit will serve as an intercessor before God, a source of strength in faith and a teacher of truth. The above two explanations come from one of my bible commentaries.

Then when looking at the readings for this Sunday from Galatians, Paul breaks it down quite succinctly. He has a detailed list, but he also tells us: the flesh has desires against the Spirit and the Spirit against the flesh, and if we are guided by the Spirit, you are not under the law. And after reading this difficult and challenging list, he concludes with: "as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God". And Paul adds: "In contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, selfcontrol. Against such there is no law". Then Paul adds the kicker: "Now those

who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified their flesh with its passion and desires. If we live in the Spirit, let us also follow the Spirit".

What do you think about Pentecost? Have you given thought as to how this includes you and everything you do, or say, and or touch? We are, as a people of God, up against what many of us either deny or do not want to believe; which is the battle against evil. Ephesians 6:12 clearly says: "For our struggle is not with flesh and blood but with the principalities, with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in the heavens".

So then for me, Pentecost means living in the Spirit. "Come Holy Spirit!" I am always trying to deepen my spiritual journey so as to be able to be better prepared for this struggle which is very real. Each RCIA candidate or catechumen I work with; I try to help them to understand that this struggle is real.

Pentecost, literally is our opportunity to rise to our higher self, and to release that worldly lower person we are constantly being tempted to be, and recognize that God will not leave us orphaned, that God will come to you. Are we willing to allow God in to our lives, and "stand firm against the tactics of the devil"? "Draw your strength from the Lord and from His mighty power", and may the peace of God be with you all the days of your life.
