by Father Amadi

Dear Parishioners,

Greetings in the Risen Christ!

I have some news to share with you. In 2020 while still serving in my previous assignment as Pastor in Algoma, Bishop Ricken asked me to enroll in the Doctorate in Ministry (DMin) program at the Catholic University of America, in Washington DC. I was to specialize in Liturgical Catechesis which will deepen my knowledge of the **Church's liturgical life and enhance my capacity to teach it well.** This doctoral study was to be in addition to my pastoral duties at the parish. Thankfully, this doctoral program had both a virtual component and a residency component which required me to be present in Washington DC in the summer. Hence, I continued with my classes even after I was appointed as Pastor of the three-linked parishes of SS. Peter and Paul, Kiel, Holy Rosary, New Holstein and St. Ann, Saint Anna.

It is quite an honor to be asked by the Bishop to study for a doctorate. I must confess, however, that it has also been quite a challenge to do it while serving full time in pastoral ministry as pastor of three-linked parishes. After 3 years of coursework and traveling to Washington DC for classes during the summer, I have been working on my dissertation for the past couple of years. In February and March 2025, I taught a number of classes as part of my doctoral project, as we explored the meaning of the symbolisms of Baptism and how it was understood in the historical context of the early Church. Some of you or your loved ones attended those classes and I remain thankful for your participation and insightful questions. I am happy to share with you that on

March 25, 2026, I successfully defended my doctoral dissertation in Washington DC and passed my final exams. On May 16, I will be in Washington DC for the Graduation Ceremony at the Catholic University of America.

As you can imagine, it is both an indescribable relief and an immense joy to be done with this task which will equip me with the training and skills to better serve God and his people as pastor of souls and teacher of the faith. I am profoundly grateful for your prayers and encouragement. In a special way, I am thankful to the parents and families who attended **last year's classes which I taught on the sacrament of Baptism**, and I am especially indebted to Lynne Becker, Kim Driscoll and Diane Pleviak who helped me in organizing the details of the classes I taught last year as part of my doctoral project.

Finally, I have already been asked if getting a doctorate means that my title will now change to something like Father Doctor Amadi. Not really! I will still be called Father Amadi as my priestly vocation is **God's greatest blessing and best gift to me.** I deeply treasure and love my vocation to the priesthood. It remains an inestimable privilege, an incredible gift and an unmerited grace to be called a spiritual father in **God's Church and to be entrusted with the care of souls as priest and pastor.** So Father Amadi, I will always be with the help of God.

Please know that I pray for you and your families while entrusting myself to your prayers also.

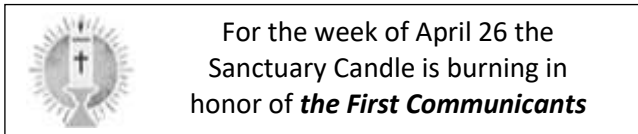

St. Ann-the Road to 175

We are 5 weeks away from the 175th celebration of our existence as a parish. Each week we will share information on our formation and continued existence as a faith community.

Week 2-Our Founders

The first German families to settle in the St. Ann area and begin the parish were the Flattens, Trimborns, Mertens, Krupps, and Voelkers.

They came here for the land as it sold for \$1.29/acre. Most of the land sales were for 40 acres or more, and some of these early settlers owned up to 320 acres (about 1/2 of a square mile.

Early church services were held in the homes of these early settlers. The pastor who served the area was Father Casper Rehrl. He was the first pastor of Johnsburg; then helped Marytown and St. Ann get organized. He founded more than 15 parishes throughout eastern Wisconsin including parishes in Fond du Lac, Sheboygan and others in the "Holyland" of northeastern Fond du Lac County. He also founded the Sisters of St. Agnes who specialized in education and nursing.

These early settlers began to clear the land for their farming enterprises to begin. One of the Trimborns, John Joseph, was killed while felling a tree on his property. He was the first person buried in the new cemetery on September 17, 1853. His gravestone is still visible in the cemetery.

The Flatten family took much of the lead in starting the parish; Englebert Flatten donated early land and Anna Catherine Flatten sold about 40 Acres to the Archdiocese of Milwaukee for \$100.00 in 1851. This is the land the present church sits on.

The parish was named St. Ann after Maria Anna Trimborn, wife of Werner Trimborn. She passed away in 1872 and her grave has been recently refurbished in our cemetery.

The Trimborns, Flattens, Mertens, Voelkers and Krupps led the parish through its early growth.

The first baptism was Joseph Voelker, son of Valentine and Barbara (Kenz) Voelker, on March 16, 1851.

The first marriage recorded was that of Lorenz Voelker and Anna Proff on February 8, 1853.

As the settlement continued to grow, the Belgian immigrants arrived, among them the ancestors of the Turba family, and the Irish settlers, the Cains, Grogans, and the Frankmans.. All of these families quickly assimilated into the new community.
