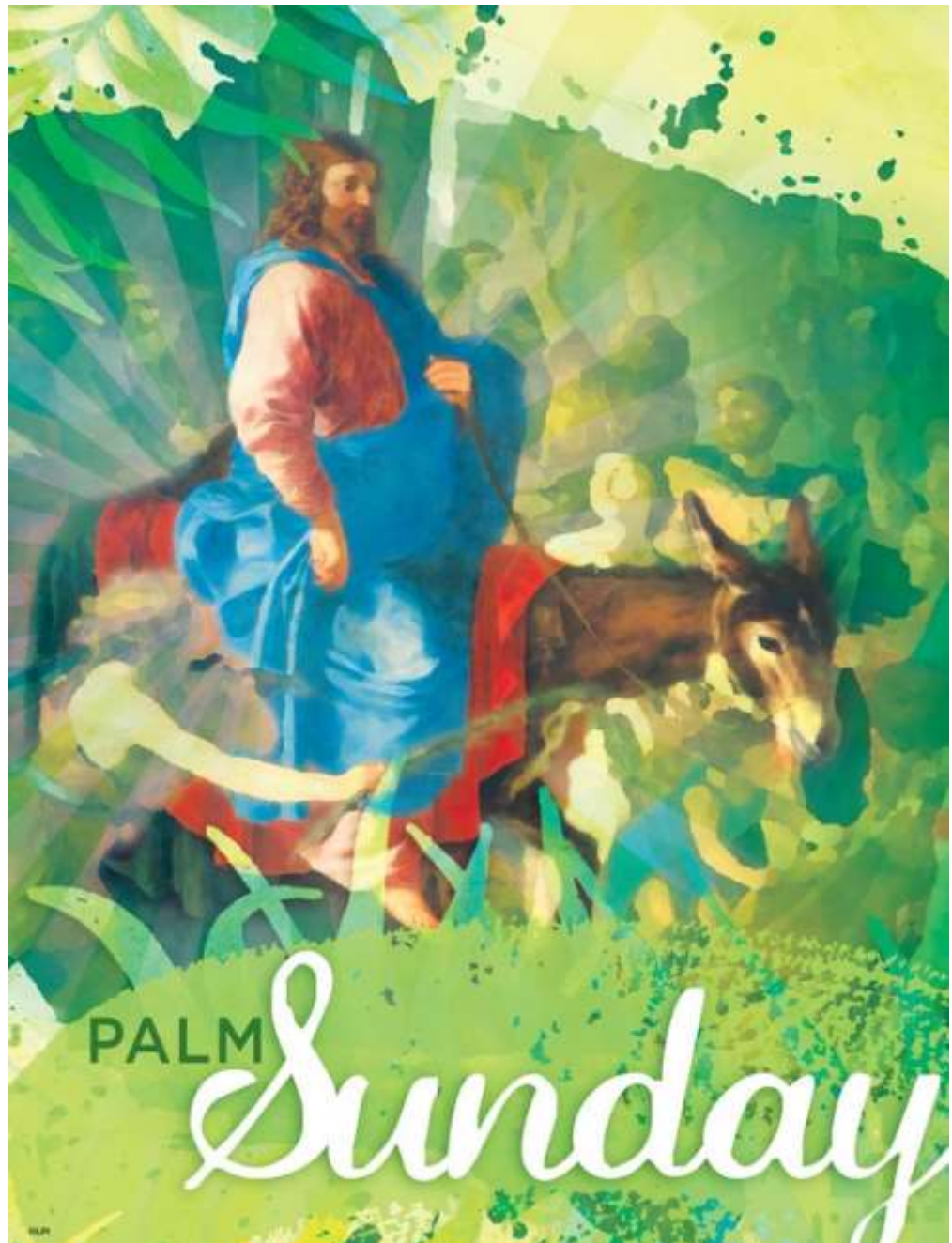

HEART OF THE REVIVAL

“We are only halfway through Lent?!”

My daughter whispered her question so loudly that I'm sure people could hear her a few pews back. Our pastor explained the significance of Laetare Sunday, an occasion of hope and rejoicing marking the halfway point through the season of Lent. But my five-year-old daughter took the news through a pessimistic filter: We still have a while before we get to Easter.

I tried to placate my little girl as best I could for the sake of those around us, but a part of me was sympathetic to her concern. Lent can seem long sometimes. But how often do we ponder why we take 40 days to prepare for Easter?

If you do a little studying, you'll find that 40 is a biblical number that often correlates with penance and renewal. We could recall the 40 years the Israelites roamed the wilderness searching for the Promised Land or the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the desert after his baptism. But the question remains: Why do we need all this preparatory time?

After all, hasn't Lent reached the point when our observances feel routine? For **many of us our Lenten penances don't sting** like they did during the first week of Lent. Perhaps you were a little rusty praying through the Stations of the Cross in February, but now you breeze through the prayers without missing a beat. It is remarkable how quickly we can settle into a new way of life.

Reflecting on my daughter's question after Mass, I was met with a sense of consolation as I reminded myself that Lent isn't primarily about our actions but God's. If Lent were shorter, we would have less time to receive all God has in store for us in this holy season.

If you share my daughter's mindset and are limping toward Easter, you still have a

couple of weeks ahead where you are expected to sacrifice and fast. But you also **have a couple more weeks to soak up God's** graces. A couple more weeks to leverage your Lenten observances to grow in intimacy with Christ. A couple more weeks to grow in greater understanding and appreciation of **God's mercy as we prepare for the Paschal Mystery.**

We don't need 40 days for Lent. Instead, **we're blessed with 40 days of Lent.** So, if you are hoping to make the most of the time we have left in this season, I have good news for you!

We are more than halfway through Lent.

Like fasting and prayer, almsgiving is non-negotiable.

Old Prescription Bottles

On the Saturday after Easter, April 26, the cities of New Holstein, Kiel and St. Ann will be asked to discard old prescription medicines. As you empty your old meds into a plastic ziploc bag, please keep the EMPTY orange/brown containers out of the landfill. Your part is this: remove the labels and wash the bottles inside and out with hot soapy water. Let them air dry and then put the caps back on. Make sure they are all the way dry so they don't mold. Put the EMPTY cleaned bottles in a clean ziploc bag and drop the bag into the designated container in your church. These bottles will be sent to Matthew 25 Ministries. They, in turn, will see that doctors in third world countries will receive them and will use them to send medicines home with their patients, knowing that the meds will stay dry and clean until needed. Palm Sunday is the last day of the Lenten 40 Days for Life campaign. There will be a **Closing Rally** from **6 – 7 p.m.** at the vigil site (the corner of S. Taylor Drive and New Jersey Ave) on Palm Sunday.
