



To continue our preparation for returning to distributing Holy Communion under both kinds on a limited basis (in accordance with Diocesan policy), there are a number of liturgical principles that shed light on this decision.

The Principle of Progressive Solemnity

By their very nature, Masses of the greatest solemnity within the liturgical year demand a higher or a fuller ritual. They include various ritual elements that are not usually contained in ordinary or regular celebrations. This principle is at work throughout the liturgical year, for example, weekday masses are shorter and less ceremonious than Sunday Masses. Music. the use of incense, singing the Gloria, reciting the Creed and the environment all help to express the principle of progressive solemnity. These varying degrees of solemnity help the faithful to understand the importance of each respective celebration.

The Care and Reverence for and Protection of the Precious Blood

The accident rate of spilling the Precious Blood during distribution is, relatively speaking, much greater than that for the Body of Christ. Unfortunately, many Catholics can remember being at Mass with the Precious Blood being spilt. Such an accident is more difficult to reverently purify than the dropping of a Host. Purification becomes more difficult in Churches that are carpeted. As small as this risk might be, it is necessary to take this precaution.

The Catholic Doctrine of Concomitance

This teaches that the entire Christ is fully present, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity within each Eucharistic species. The Church came to understand that because Christ's Eucharistic presence is entirely dependent upon His presence in heaven (which is undivided), He must be present in the Eucharist as He is present in heaven.

Being integral and undivided at the right hand of His Father, so too Christ's Body and Blood cannot be separated or divided in the Eucharist. Rather, the whole Christ is present within each Eucharistic element. Consequently, a person who receives only one species without the other does not receive less Christ or less grace, nor one part of Christ at the exclusion of any other, nor even less grace than a person who receives both species. Put simply, one

does not receive "more Jesus" when one receives Holy Communion in both species, rather reception from the Cup offers another or a different opportunity to receive the same Eucharistic Lord who was already fully received within the Consecrated Host.

Intinction

This is the practice of dipping the Consecrated Host in the Precious Blood before consuming it. In the Diocese of Green Bay, this way of receiving communion for the Lay faithful is not allowed because it undermines the idea of "receiving" the precious gift of the Eucharist by giving the impression of taking it on one's own terms. Put simply dipping is not allowed.

Placing a crucifix on the Altar

Finally, beginning from the Solemnity of Corpus Christi (weekend of June 1/2), we shall be placing a crucifix on the Altar in our three parishes. This is an ancient liturgical practice in the Catholic Church because on the Altar is effected the Sacrifice of the Cross made present under sacramental signs. Hence, a crucifix is placed visibly on the Altar, to constantly call to mind for the priest and the people, "the saving Passion of the Lord" (The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 308). So the big crucifix in the sanctuary faces the congregation while the Altar crucifix faces the priest to remind both priest and people of the Lord's saving passion.

Corpus Christi

The day is almost here! Where we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We will begin after the 10:00 Mass at Holy Rosary, then process to St. Ann and end with Benediction at Ss. Peter & Paul. Those 2nd graders who made their first communion this year are asked to join in the procession. What a beautiful way of giving public witness to the faith and devotion of the Christian people toward the sacrament. And you get to spend time with your parish families and to enter into union with Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. Please see the insert for details.

This new fee structure will not be applied retroactively to those who have already paid the appropriate amount from the former fee scale. The new fee structure will be applied to all new requests received as of July 1, 2024 when we will

start accepting mass & candles requests for 2025.

Please know, too, that any stipend money collected goes to the parish in support of its ministry and services provided to the parish community; it does not go personally to the priest.


