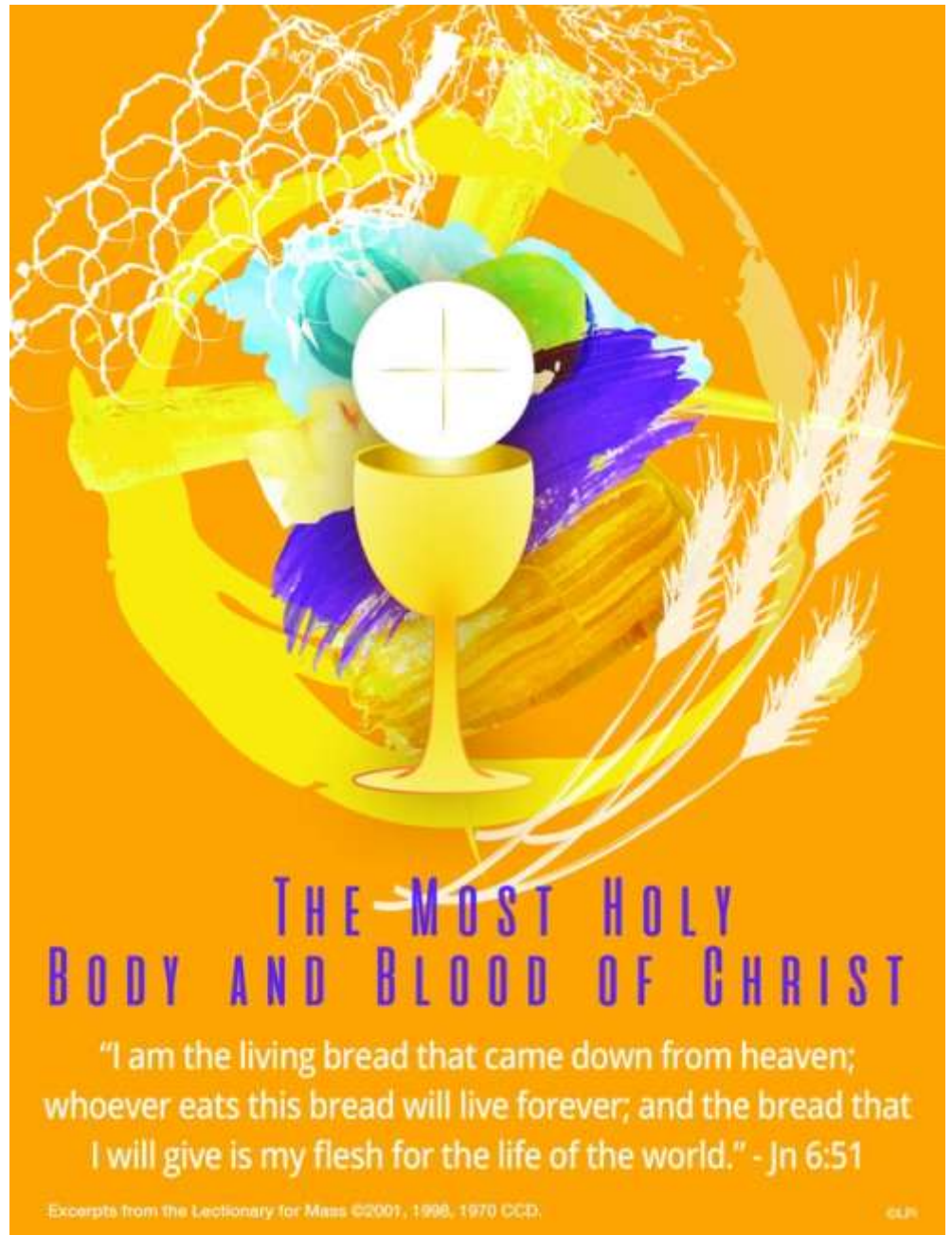

Deacon's Perspective

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ — the feast of the Eucharist, the Real Presence of Jesus among us. In my ministry, I have met many good people who simply do not understand the gift of the Eucharist. When I go to nursing homes for visits I ask if the residents would like Communion. Here are some replies:

One nursing home resident said, **“It wouldn’t hurt.”**

Another said, **“I guess it would be okay,” while focusing on a puzzle.**

A third said, **“I hope God can keep track of everything — it’s hard to do.”**

These are not bad people. They are simply people who have never been taught what the Eucharist truly is. If we do not understand the Eucharist, we cannot understand what it means to become a living host — a soul in whom Jesus continues His Eucharistic life.

In her writings, Servant of God Luisa Piccarreta was told by Jesus that the soul who lives in His Divine Will becomes a **“living host.”**

Jesus said to her:

“Souls who live in My Will are true living hosts.” (Vol. 11, Mar. 15, 1912)

“Your body and will are the accidents — the veil — in which I hide Myself.” (Vol. 12, Oct. 20, 1917)

“I continue My Eucharistic Life in souls who let Me live in them.” (Vol. 11, Dec. 17, 1914)

This is a profound truth: Jesus desires to continue His Eucharistic life in us. The Eucharist is not only something we receive — it is something we are called to become.

A living host is someone who:

let’s Jesus think in their thoughts

loves with His love

forgives with His mercy

serves with His humility

becomes a small “Eucharist” for others

A non-living host is someone who receives Jesus but does not allow Him to transform their life. The Eucharist is not meant to remain in the tabernacle of the church — it is meant to live in the tabernacle of our hearts.

God created each of us for this moment in history. You and I were born for this time, for this world, for **this moment in God’s story. He placed you here with a purpose in His Divine Will. And He gives you all the grace you need to fulfill that purpose.**

The Eucharist is the food that strengthens us to live that mission. It is Jesus giving Himself completely to us, so that we may give ourselves completely to Him. Corpus Christi is not only about adoring Jesus — it is about becoming like Him.

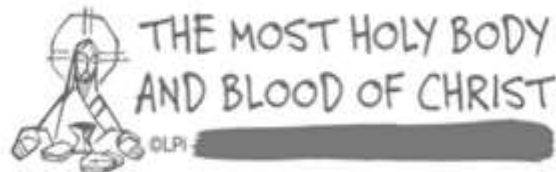
Many of you know that much of my spirituality lies in the writings of Luisa Piccarreta, and the following prayer is inspired by her and the Kingdom of the Divine Will.

Lord Jesus, Body and Blood given for our salvation, we thank You for the gift of the Eucharist — Your very Life offered, hidden, and poured out for us.

Strengthen us with Your Eucharistic life so we may become who You created us to be — a reflection of Your goodness, a sign of Your mercy, a living host carrying Your presence into the world.

Grant us the grace to let You live in us and through us. Empty us of anything that does not belong to You, and fill us with everything we need to do Your Will each day. Jesus in the Eucharist, remain with us, transform us, and make us Yours.

Amen.



Missionary Cooperation Plan

Next weekend we will welcome a representative of the **Missionary Society of St. Paul (MSP)**. It is a congregation of priests founded in Nigeria in 1977. The Society now has 300 priests. They are working in eleven countries of Africa, (South Africa, Malawi, Botswana, Cameroon, Liberia, Chad, Central African Republic, The Gambia, Nigeria, Kenya, and Southern Sudan. They have over 140 seminarians in Nigeria.

Their missions in rural parts of Africa provide food and support for children. They run elementary schools to cater for the educational needs of children from poor families and assist young people with vocational training. They need funds to: 1) provide freshwater wells, and health care in rural communities; 2) Sponsoring seminarians, our future priests; 3) Supporting priests in the founding/building of new churches.
