The terms "Deacon" and "Diaconate" derive from the Greek word diakonia which means "service" or "ministry". A deacon then, is ordained by the Church for service. In that respect, Deacons deserve much affirmation you apply. You might also begin to see a for their tireless work, proclaiming the word of God, giving homilies, performing baptisms, and witnessing marriages, among other responsibilities. These selfless servants are fully ordained clergy, reporting directly to the bishop. Married men may become deacons and have families; they often work in a secular job in addition to their diaconal role.

What do deacons do:

Proclaim the Gospel Assist the Priest at Mass Baptize Witness marriages Perform funeral and burial services outside of the Eucharist Distribute Holy Communion Preach the homily Visit the sick Teach the faith Provide counsel for couples and individuals Preside at Holy Hour and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament Assist pastors

Ouestion:

At a parish council meeting, our pastor mentioned the need for deacons. It is something I am considering. How do I know if I have a vocation? What steps should I take next?

Answer:

Any and all gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to the church are for the good of the community. As members of the Body of Christ, what one

member does affects all. What the body does also affects each member. A vocation or call to ministry is tested and verified by the church. Through prayer, instruction, and service, a vocation is tested, and then acknowledged by the official call to orders or to service.

If you are considering becoming a deacon, the first step would be to talk to your pastor. He will be able to give you more specific information on the program in your diocese, what is expected of you, and how spiritual director, someone who can help you with your faith journey and vocation discernment. They do so by focusing on prayer, your relationship with God, and spiritual practices. Finally, you'll need to see the diocesan vocation director in charge of deacons to apply. Best wishes!
