



Use of Incense at Mass

It has come to my attention that there are a few parishioners who are bothered by our occasional use of incense at Mass, especially for the more solemn liturgies. I understand that this is especially the case with people with respiratory and other health challenges. As a result, please note that the parish will be purchasing hypoallergenic incense. Many parishes with similar issues have reported that the hypoallergenic incense works very well. The kind of incense we currently use will be discontinued.

Someone might ask what's the deal with incense anyway? Wouldn't it be better to forgo it completely? No. we would not and here's why. The use of incense at Mass is an expression of reverence and of prayer. Being a timehonored component of catholic ritual prayer, it serves as a symbol of the prayers of God's people rising up to God. Sacred Scripture speaks eloquently of the incense as part of the ancient tradition of prayer and sacrifice. "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (Ps 141:2).



Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question: Why do priests kiss the altar at the start of Mass?

Answer: Our churches and chapels are filled with symbols. We might think of the more common symbols (like the crucifix, statues, stained-glass windows, vestment color and altar cloths) as well as major symbols (such as the paschal candle and the baptismal font). But there are some things that we can take for granted in our sacred spaces, because unfortunately, they seem to just be part of the building, including three of the main symbols of our liturgy: the ambo (lectern), the chair for the priest celebrant, and the altar.

These three objects are placed in a specially designated area called the sanctuary. They are the places where the Word of God is proclaimed, where the priest prays and presides at the celebration, and where the bread and wine are offered by the priest during the Eucharistic Prayer. Although each of these objects is sacred because of the role they play in our worship, the altar holds Galatians 6:10). a special place. In a document containing the rules and instructions for the Mass the "General Instruction of the Roman Missal" — we read: "The altar on which the

Sacrifice of the Cross is made present under sacramental signs is also the table of the Lord to which the People of God is called together to participate in the Mass, as well as the center of the thanksgiving that is accomplished throughout the Eucharist" (no. 296).

One of the ways that we recognize the importance of the altar is when the priest and deacon kiss the altar at the beginning of Mass. Kissing is an ancient act of devotion. Remember, we also kiss the cross on Good Friday, and the deacon or priest kisses the "Book of the Gospels" after the Gospel is proclaimed. This act of devotion reminds us that the altar is a symbol of Jesus, the "living stone" (see 1 Peter 2:4), the foundation stone of our faith. It is a symbol gesture, but it is a powerful reminder of the One on whom our faith is built and in whose name we gather as the "household of faith" (see

Lent

Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may only eat one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

When you experience the gentleness of Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, with His help, you will be more and more able to forgive yourself, to accept your weakness, to love your neighbor as yourself. Approach the Sacrament today and ask for the grace to forgive yourself, just as Jesus forgives you.


