Deacon's Perspective

"It is I who arm you, though you know me not." Isaiah 45:5b "We know, beloved of God, how you were chosen." 1 Thes 1:4

Earlier this week, I had an interesting conversation with a manager of small business. This person asked me to wait until the customer in line behind me left the premises. After the customer left, the manager said "I hope you don't think I'm crazy or weird" but I have to ask you a question. Can you please bless this building? There are things happening in this building that do not make sense. We just had new equipment installed with new electrical wiring and it is malfunctioning, things are missing, and then I find them in a different spot. There is more to the story that I won't go into it, but the point I'm trying to make is "*When have you known God to work through a surprising, or 'enemy' source?*" I know this is a different column for our bulletin, but I also know that God is constantly trying to get our attention; so, when, or how has God gotten your attention?

I was completely caught off guard; taken by surprise! My intention was to take care of what I needed to purchase and get to my next destination; I was in a hurry; and this question and the things happening took me by surprise. When I think of the question above, this conversation with this manager was not only a surprise, but also the enemy or perceived enemy is the source of the problem. We continued with our conversation, and I told this person how I would help, but equally important is that I paused and listened to this person's concerns and fears. There is a term or phrase I often use which is the "Ministry of Presence". Being present for someone in a time of need is a 'time of grace' given to each of us, and God in this moment is calling on us to respond with the gift we were given. Each of us received a gift from God to be used to glorify God, and or to bring someone to God. If we surrender ourselves to "the Holy Spirit with complete conviction" what grace might enter the world through us!

Paul in our second reading admits that the power of the Holy Spirit and not mere human skill at preaching led the Thessalonians to conversion. Think of how much good the church (you and I) could do if we, the church, were convinced of this. Instead we worry about lack of talent or lack of funds and say we are not prepared to witness. We forget that we are mere vessels that God can fill with light. How has God used your weak-ness to Divine advantage?

I heard from a priest something that I haven't given thought to before, which is: "Your interior disposition, form your intention". We saw this in the Gospel from the disciples of the Pharisees and the Herodians, and how they tried to entrap Jesus. We have the choice to allow God to work through us, and with us, for the good. Keep in mind that it is a choice, do not lose sight of this. And do remember that "Nothing is Random with God", and that the source may be a surprise or the enemy challenging us.

Someone you know could use some good news. Let the Holy Spirit and complete conviction drive the encounter. Give to God what is God's: your willing heart.

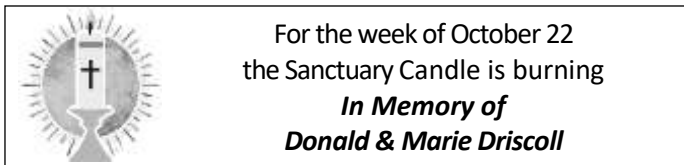

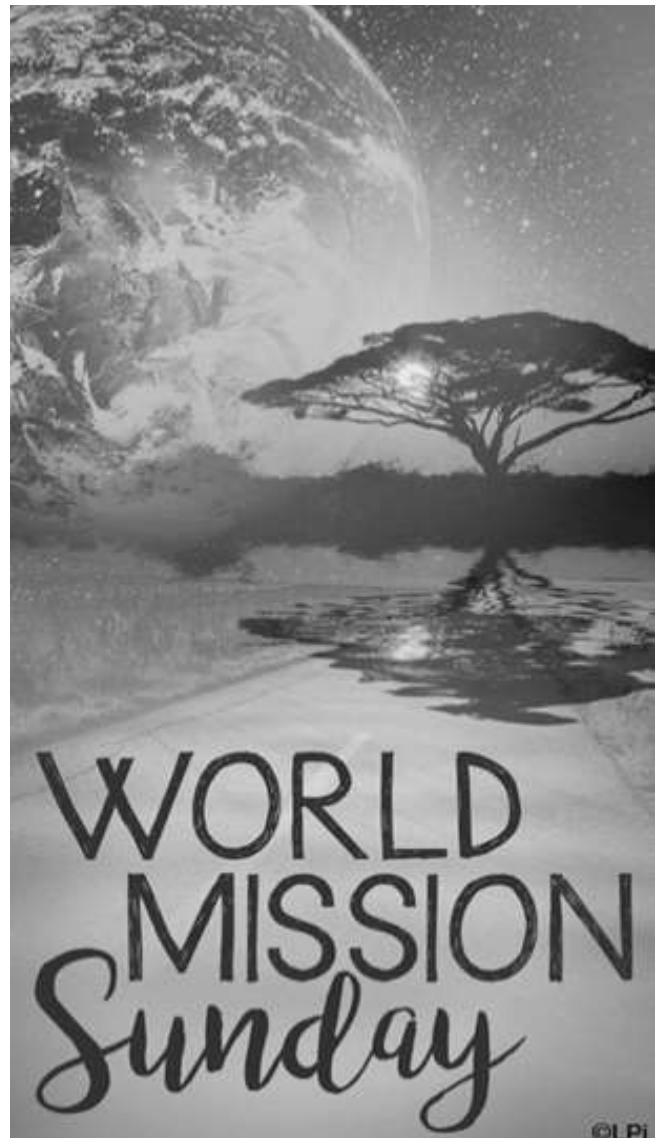
